Reflections



Pastor Transition Team

Exodus 18:14-15 When Moses' father-in-law saw all that Moses was doing for the people, he asked, "What are you really accomplishing here? Why are you trying to do all this alone while everyone stands around you from morning till evening?"

In other words, Jethro advised Moses to delegate.

Moses, Jethro warned, must delegate authority to trusted judges who will seek the leader's counsel, only in the most difficult cases. Moses' father-in-law, a priest in his own community, knew that this would be too great a task for one person. It was Jethro's recommendation that Moses select others to help govern the people. This would help prepare the people to run as an organized community when finally, they would enter the promised land.

Who would have thought that delegating and cooperating would be two of God's most precious gifts?

The Pastor Transition Team has been working behind the scenes to make sure the roles and responsibilities that occur during a transition process are not left undone. Please be patient with us as we are still learning, discovering, and finding solutions to issues as they present themselves.

We would like to express our sincerest gratitude to our staff members who have taken on extra work during this transition period. We are very lucky, as a congregation, to have such wonderful people in these roles. They have graciously and generously agreed to the added responsibilities. We would also like to thank the many volunteers who also are rolling up their sleeves to help keep things running smoothly. Like Moses, we can't do this alone.






