### May 1 Care for Creation: RDR (Recommended Daily Responsibility)

Review the basics of what should be placed in your recycling bin and how those recyclables should be prepared so they can be made into new materials and objects. Time will be allowed for sharing strategies to reduce waste and reuse materials before needing the recycling bin. We will offer an adult education program describing three important aspects of our current non-profit organization: 1. Bev Gudex and Mary Ellen McMeen, both past NAMI presidents, will recall the history of putting our NAMI back together in Fond du Lac in 1997. 2. Laura Rau, a NAMI trained facilitator and parent of a child with a mental health condition, will discuss one of our best free Signature Programs, NAMI Basics, a 6-session education program for parents, caregivers and other family who provide care for youth, ages 22 and younger. 3. A consumer/member of Friendship Corner will talk about his journey with mental illness and how he became a peer Opener/Closer at Friendship Corner.

Join Jodi Anderson and her son Liam as she shares how she uses her experiences with Liam to encourage and assist other parents of children with combined vision and hearing losses. You will learn about the Wisconsin DeafBlind Technical Assistance Project. Deafblindness is a disability of access that may bring great challenges, both to the children who live with combined vision and hearing losses, but also to the parents and educators who live or work with these children. The Wisconsin Deafblind Project assists parents and service providers to better understand the learning needs of the child who is deafblind and acquire strategies that have proven successful. Through this program, families have an opportunity to establish a supportive relationship with an experienced and trained parent of a child who is deafblind.

- Discussed holding an organizational Session meeting on a Saturday in July.
- Began laying the groundwork for development of a congregational mission study group.

Looking even farther ahead, Session is excited to be getting a new class of elders in July.

## Easter Isn't Over!

Was your Easter over too soon? Did you want to spend more time on food, family, and fun? Do you wish you could have spent longer fully appreciating God's good news that we are not stuck, that by the power of God's love we can start again – and not just once but time after time?



If you wish Easter could last longer then you are in luck. Easter is not just one event. Easter is an entire season. Easter is not just one day. Easter is fifty days!

That's right. We are now in what is known as Easter Tide, the Season of Easter, or the Great Fifty Days. This is the period between Easter (April 17) and Pentecost (June 5). Both Holy days correspond to pre-existing Jewish festivals: the first day of Pesach (Passover) and the holiday of Shavuoth (The Feast of Weeks, [Greek: Pentecost.]

During these fifty days we intentionally celebrate Jesus' resurrection and its meaning and power for our lives. Besides Bible reading and prayer, here are a few other ways to make this holy season meaningful:

**Read the Resurrection and Post-Resurrection stories** in each of the four Gospels. How are they alike? How do they differ? Which story do you prefer? Why?

**Read the Book of Acts.** By reading a chapter a day you'll be done in just four weeks. Beginning on Ascension (May 26), Acts is the story of how the news of Jesus' resurrection spread outward from Jerusalem (the author's spiritual center of the world) all the way Rome (the recognized political center of the world). Learn about Peter's preaching to the Gentiles and Paul's conversion and missionary journeys – complete with prison, shipwrecks, stonings and a trip to Rome.

**Deliberately go out and enjoy nature.** Look for signs of Spring and how nature is starting again. If you want to, take some pictures and post them on your Facebook page.

**Make a daily point of being grateful for something new.** Skip the familiar 'food, family and jobs' and look around. Be grateful for how that fluffy towel feels on your skin, your best friend's surprisingly good singing, how you hit every greenlight on the way to work one day. Write them down and share them with someone you value and trust.

**Take time to be creative.** Make a new recipe. Mix-up the route of your morning run. Try a new hobby for a few weeks to see if you like it.

**Nurture:** something, someone, even (especially) yourself. Plant a flower and watch it grow. Renew an old acquaintance. Encourage a child with a kind word, by attending their recital or sending an appropriate card. Spend 15 minutes, three days per week, in silent meditation.

The Holy Season of Easter reminds us how Jesus brought joy to our lives with the assurance of our salvation. But we don't need to wait to experience that joy. We can do it now. May your Easter season be a time of not just knowing but experiencing that Christ is Risen. He is Risen indeed!



*Like A Garden: A Biblical Spirituality of Growth* Book Study

What is it about a garden that has such strong attraction for so many of us? In *Like a Garden*, author Sara Covin Juengst



answers this question as she explores the way the metaphor of the garden is used in the Bible. The book looks at how the various garden images are used to convey ideas of God's providential care, our responsibility to steward the earth, the discipline of the Christian life, what it means to bear fruit, and the harvest waiting for us in the new heaven and earth. It also discusses ancient gardening routines, such as plowing, planting, and pruning, to shed light on the significance of the symbolism used in biblical passages that use these images. You do not need to be a gardener to participate but be willing to look at life through the metaphors of the garden.
