My Beloved -

Despite the mass exodus of vacationers making the most of summer, July was a very full month here at FPC FDL. We began the month with Usher Training and a Dock Spiders game. Despite our best efforts, the Spiders were squished. On the plus side, I was introduced to indoor tailgating, which was a lot of fun.

Our month ended with an initial presentation by our Congregational Mission Study
Team. After the presentation, the team handed out surveys to be turned into the
office, or completed online, NLT August 14. I CANNOT OVER EMPHASISE HOW
IMPORTANT THIS SURVEY IS. Whereas the presentation mainly focused on who we were, this
survey will tell us who we are now. Please be sure to fill it out. It will probably take you about 10
minutes.

In the middle of the month, our session met for six hours on a Saturday for an organizational meeting. We spent time in devotions and sharing. We heard from our Executive Presbyter and our Treasurer. We worked on mastering the subtle intricacies of our Book of Order and reviewed our organizational structure. Happily, our Session dove straight in and accomplished a great deal. I cannot say enough about their enthusiasm and goodwill.

I hope that their enthusiasm and good will are contagious. Churches should be places of vibrancy and hope. After all, we worship the God of the living. We worship the God of resurrection. Even in hard times, even as churches across America are shrinking, we remain a people of vibrancy and hope. As I have said before, pessimism is not a Christian character trait.

If you saw the presentation last Sunday, you know we are facing some important issues in our future. We are not alone in this regard. Most other mainline Protestant churches are facing these issues as well. But there is nothing one-size-fits-all about them. Each church must face them for themselves.

But facing these issues is NOT just the job of the leadership. We are all stakeholders in our church, and we ALL have a part to play in steering our church through these difficult times.

How can you help? I'm glad you asked! Three ways immediately come to mind.

Be involved. Being here from 9:00 – 10:00 on Sunday is wonderful but why stop there? Attend Fellowship Time after worship. Drop in on a Sunday School class. Take part in a men's or women's group during the week. If you see an interesting event coming up, speak to someone about it. Volunteer for part of the setup or breakdown for Fellowship Time. Find a team that speaks to your interests and volunteer to serve it for 3 or 4 months. We are a vital, busy congregation but too much of our vitality and busyness is in the hands of too few parishioners. The rest of us need to claim our share of the love.

Be generous. Be generous with your time. Be generous with your skills. If you can, be generous with your financial support of our life and ministry together. The CMST presentation made a particular point of our financial condition.

Grow in faith. We grow in faith by worshipping, of course (and don't forget that our livestream is a valid option). But also, we grow in faith through your own prayer and Bible study. Just 10 minutes a day, Monday through Saturday, is an hour a week. If you don't know how to approach the Bible, begin with the New Testament. Starting with Matthew, read a chapter or two a day. Where do you see yourself in the text? Where do you see our church? Where do you see our ministry? Pray every day. If you're uncomfortable praying, bring your bulletin home every week and pray the prayer that is printed there. Ask yourself the same questions about the prayer that you asked about the Bible passage.

I know I've said it before but please let me say it again. We are a good church. We are a vibrant church. I'm sure we won't have any problem attracting a new installed pastor.

Yes, we have issues to face but we are blessed with good, motivated, and dedicated leaders. No, our leaders can't do it all themselves. We, too, have to play our part and accept our fair share of responsibility for our church's life and mission.

But if we do, there will be no stopping us. May August be as wonderful as July.


