January Session Highlights

Session held its annual training/organizational meeting on Saturday, January 28. The day-long meeting was spent getting to know one another better, personal and spiritual development, reflecting on the church as a whole, as well as how Session feels things should be done in the future. It was a very informational day filled with plenty of snacks and good food supplied by the attendees.

One of the outcomes of the day was that the Session decided to create a Worship Team. This issue was raised in November and after careful discernment, session thought that worship issues needed to be more of a focus at the Session level. Responsibilities were removed from the Loving Team and assigned to the new Worship Team. The team will work closely with Kris Bartelt, the Worship Coordinator, to ensure that we continue to have excellent worship opportunities at FPC.

Session reluctantly received Pastor Ken's announcement he plans to make Easter Sunday his last day of employment here at First Presbyterian. If he gets a new call, the time-frame may be adjusted. Pastor Ken indicated that he felt he had accomplished what was asked of him and that his presence here could be a hindrance to the Pastor Nominating Committee's work. Time was spent reflecting on this. Session must now consider its next steps.

Members nominated to serve on the newly formed Pastor Nominating Committee are Bonnie Hughes, Dan Baker, Kim Braatz, and Mike Warntjes. Their names were put to a congregational vote on Sunday. All were elected, by the congregation, to serve on the PNC.

Every year, the Clerk of Session prepares a report called the Annual Statistical Report. This report (see page 2) shows information regarding our church membership and its finances. This information is used by the denomination to study trends occurring in its churches. The information is also used to determine how much our per capita payment will be the following year. The key takeaway from this document is the drop in membership over the year, going from 318 to 255. This was primarily due to the work of the Membership Committee reviewing the church's rolls.

Session's work is never boring, and it looks like we're in for some exciting times ahead.

February Affirmations from Pastor Ken

"Doing Anything New for Lent?"

On February 22nd we will celebrate Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Holy Season of Lent. We will have an Ash Wednesday service, complete with ashes and communion. But while Ash Wednesday is important, it is only the beginning of Lent.

During Lent, we encourage you to participate in a period of fasting, repentance, moderation, self-denial, and spiritual discipline. The purpose is, first of all, to set aside time for reflection on Jesus - to consider his suffering and his sacrifice, his life, death, burial, and resurrection. But also, we can use the disciplines and time to reflect on our own life and how we minister to others in Jesus' name.



The early Christians knew that Easter calls for special preparations. In their own way, they prepared themselves to celebrate the joy of Jesus' resurrection. But now it's our turn and we need to find ways that are meaningful to us. Typical commitments are to such activities as giving up smoking, watching TV, swearing, or giving up a food or drink, such as sweets, chocolate, or coffee.

But frankly, those are rather commonplace. This year, think about stepping outside of the usual Lenten box. Here are a few "Alternative Lenten Disciplines" you may want to explore.

- **+When you walk your dog,** take along a trash bag and clean up the roads in your neighborhood. How can we better care for God's creation?
- **+One or two days a week,** eat like a refugee by consuming less than 1,800 calories. Or pick one day a week and fast for those 24 hours. Does it move you to reconsider the plight of displaced persons? The food insecure? Those who can only afford the most basic foods, never knowing the luxury of a special treat.
- **+Volunteer your time** at one of the many non-profits in our area. Where would Jesus volunteer? How often would Jesus volunteer?
- **+Twice a week (or more),** write a letter to someone who matters to you and thank them for being in your life. What makes them special? Have you thanked God for their presence in your life?
- +Attend our Lenten Book Studies beginning at the end of February.
- **+Turn off the TV on Saturday night.** Read through the bulletin and the Scripture lessons for Sunday (they are in your Sunday Update email). Go to bed early so that you are refreshed on Sunday morning.
- **+Pick a book of the Bible** you don't know very well and read it cover-to-cover. If you have time, read it again. What are its main themes? What is its relevance for today?
- **+Sign up for** the daily devotionals from the Presbyterian Mission Agency yearbook: https://www.presbyterianmission.org/yearbook/ Thank God that you are part of a denomination engaged in such active witness.
- **+Create phone 'dead times'** when you don't look at your phone. For the first hour after you wake up? An hour before bed? Not until after worship on Sundays? How hard is it? Do you have a phone habit? A phone addiction?
- **+Start a gratitude journal.** Every night at bedtime, write down five things that happened that day for which you are grateful. Does it change your perspective on life?
- **+Learn to bake bread.** Share some with a neighbor you've been meaning to meet. How did it go?

- +Learn to bake bread. Share some with a neighbor you've been meaning to meet. How did it go?
- **+Every time you start your car,** deliberately pause, and pray the Lord's Prayer. Do you rush through it? Do you notice a way it applies to what you are about to do?

I pray that God will lead all of us, each in our own way, to a meaningful Lent and a joyful Easter.


Updates on the Operations Team projects:

What is Per Capita?



Per Capita

In the Presbyterian Church USA system of governance, each member of the congregation is assessed a *per capita* amount to support the work of the church through its three governing levels.

The per capita money is divided as follows:

Winnebago Presbytery 66%
Synod of Lakes & Prairies 14%
General Assembly 20%
(the national ruling body)

This *per capita* covers the cost of operating these three separate entities, various committees, and commissions, along with funding the annual General Assembly Meeting.

Our congregation has supported this assessment as an appropriate way to assist in helping to meet the needs of our denomination.

For 2023, the per capita amount is \$38.00 for each church member. First Presbyterian Church will pay this amount regardless of whether you contribute. The per capita amount is a separate charge from the money you have pledged, to the church, for its operations.

A Brief History of One Great Hour of Sharing

February 9, 2015

The One Great Hour of Sharing Offering, received during Lent, has a sixty-nine-year history as an ecumenical endeavor that now involves nine denominations and Church World Service. Founded in 1946 by Episcopal Bishop Henry Knox Sherrill, a goal was set to raise one million dollars in one hour for World Relief. *



The first Presbyterian participation in this ecumenical offering was initiated in 1947 by the former United Presbyterian Church in the United States of America (UPCUSA), followed in 1948 by the former Presbyterian Church in the United States (PCUS). In 1949, church leaders from several denominations began working together to promote this effort. Major networks broadcast a show, called "One Great Hour", on Saturday, March 26 at 10pm EST. The broadcast, featuring President Truman and popular musicians and actors of the time, closed with the request to make a sacrificial contribution at their own place of worship the next morning. While there is no record of funds raised that day, it is estimated that over 75,000 churches participated.

Over time, many aspects of the offering and its participants have changed, but the purpose remains the same: to collect special gifts for those in need – including disaster relief, refugee assistance and development aid.

Allocations within our denomination have also changed over the years, but the 202nd General Assembly (1990) voted to accept the current structure:


- 32 percent to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance
- 32 percent to Self-Development of People
- 36 percent to the Presbyterian Hunger Program

This number ensures that your donation will be added to **our** pack on **April 1, 2023**.

Our goal for the April 1 MobilePack is to pack 108,864 meals at a cost of \$32,000 utilizing 500 volunteers! We have already raised \$7,000 towards this goal!

There are two ways that you can help with the MobilePack campaign - with a monetary donation and/or volunteering your time to pack the meals. Each meal costs 29 cents so every donation makes an impact. A donation of \$106 will feed a child for an entire year!
