Written for Pentecost by a British Baptist pastor, this text is full of biblical terms like "Ebenezer" (1 Samuel 7:12) Hebrew for "a stone of help" set up to give thanks for God's assistance.

*Call to Confession

God does not wait for us to be righteous, or pure, or perfect. Christ died for us while we were still sinners. We do not have to hide our sin from God, but can face it with Jesus, who heals us, teaches us, and leads us to new life.

*Confession

God of mercy, you sent Jesus Christ to seek and save the lost. We confess that we have strayed from you and turned aside from your way.

We are misled by pride, for we see ourselves pure when we are stained, and great when we are small.

We have failed in love, neglected justice, and ignored your truth.

Have mercy, O God, and forgive our sin. Return us to the paths of righteousness through Jesus Christ, our Savior.

Silent Confession (In the silence of our hearts we confess our sins to God.)

*Assurance of Pardon

We know that God is with us even in our sufferings, for suffering produces endurance, endurance produces character, character produces hope,

and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts.

In Jesus the Christ, God's love has been poured into our hearts. **In Jesus the Christ, we are forgiven. Thanks be to God. Amen.**

*Responding to God's Grace:
