Thanksgiving is coming soon.! As has been our mission for many years, we have provided food bags for families and individuals who have a mental health diagnosis and receive services at the Fond du Lac County Department of Community Programs (DCP).

The people we serve have been diagnosed with what is known as "severe and persistent mental illness. Some attend the Day Treatment Program, a structured, encouraging, supportive activity that is held at DCP, four days a week. Others have Outreach Workers who work regularly in the community with his/her consumer to maintain stability and safety. All of our identified recipients have an assigned Psychiatrist and take psychotropic medications. Nursing services are available for medication management.

Almost all of our recipients live at the poverty level. The survive on SSI (Supplemental Security Income) and Medicaid benefits. All live independently, in HUD Housing, rooming houses, "shared living homes" or with their families. Some of our families have children.

Every year we get feedback from those we serve. Some of our singles ask, with hope, if they will be getting a "bag" again. They look forward to their meal and are so grateful that we remember them. For many people with severe mental illness (schizophrenia), socialization is difficult. While churches and other organizations provide Thanksgiving Day meals, our mission allows people to have food, at their residence, on Thanksgiving Day and leftovers for the next day or two, with a minimum of stress.

We are faithfully ministering to "the least of these, our brethren" in this mission.

We shop for the usual fair: turkey, gravy, sweet potatoes, corn, green beans, pears, applesauce, cranberry sauce, fresh carrots, boxed mash potatoes, stuffing, rolls, pumpkin pie and cookies!

We pack the bags in the Day Treatment area of DCP, label the bags for individuals or family, with a note wishing them a Happy Thanksgiving. We say a prayer, ourselves, for the blessing and joy *we* receive for the success of this special mission. DCP outreach workers deliver the food.

In 2022, we provided food for 14 singles and two families. Both families had children. The price of all the items purchased was slightly over \$900.00.

There will be a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Center, beginning November 5, for those who are interested in shopping, transporting food, sorting, bagging and labeling bags. We will meet at Festival Foods, on November 20, at 9:00am. You can also make a financial donation to support this mission. Please mark your monetary gift accordingly and place it in the offering plate or drop it off in the church office.

The Head Start program promotes school readiness for children ages 3-5, from low-income families, by enhancing cognitive, social, and emotional development.



Pumpkin Cobbler - from The Beachy Family 10.29.2023 - Popular Treat from Fellowship Time

Ingredients:

- 15oz Pumpkin Puree (not pie filling!)
- 3 eggs
- ½ cup granulated sugar
- ½ cup Brown sugar packed
- 2tsp Pumpkin pie spice
- 2 tsp cinnamon divided
- 12oz evaporated milk
- 15oz Yellow Cake mix
- ¹/₂ cup unsalted butter (melted)

½ cup pecans chopped

Instructions

In a medium mixing bowl, whisk together pumpkin puree, eggs, granulated sugar, brown sugar, pumpkin pie spice, and 1 tsp cinnamon until well combined.

Add the evaporated milk and stir well.

Pour the mixture into a large crockpot that has been lightly coated with nonstick cooking spray.

In a medium mixing bowl, whisk together the cake mix with the remaining 1 tsp cinnamon. Stir in the melted butter (the mix will be clumpy).

Sprinkle the cake mix all over the pumpkin in the crockpot.

Set the crockpot to low and cook for 4 hours or high for 2 hours. Sprinkle the nuts over top about halfway through the cooking time. Serve warm with ice cream or whipped cream.
