February 11 - Souper Bowl of Caring

The PYA will be participating in the 34th Annual Souper Bowl of Caring on February 11th, 2024. In 1990, Souper Bowl of Caring began with a simple prayer from a single youth group:

"Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat."

Since then, more than \$193 million has been generated for local charities across the country through Souper Bowl of Caring. It has become a powerful movement that is transforming the time around the 'Big Game' into the nation's largest celebration of giving and serving. Through this mission, people learn they can make a positive difference in the world as they collect food, raise money, and show caring and compassion in local communities across the country.

Over the years, our PYA has collected \$8,137 and donated 2395 food items in conjunction with Souper Bowl of Caring. What's more, ALL money and food collected will stay right here in the Fond du Lac, going directly to our Tackle Hunger Charity of Choice: the Fondy Food Pantry. Last year we donated 218 food items and \$1,167 to the pantry.



Rejoicing for our Angel Tree Mission! Our Angel Tree is tucked away and the packages are safely delivered to Head Start. 2023 was joyous year for the kids and families who received our many gifts. Our congregation once again shared in their joy by giving so generously and lovingly to the children who benefit from them.

We had Families A through O. We had a total of 50 children: 22 girls and 28 boys, and one parent on our list. Every child, from 7 months to 17 years, had a request for fun things: toys, games, and learning/drawing projects. Dinosaurs were quite popular. Twenty-two girls and twenty-two boys had requests for shirts and pants, four asked for pajamas. Plus there were 19 requests for shoes, 7 for snow boots, 5 for coats, and one for snow pants. There were many other items, too many to list, all very much appreciated by parents and children.

Jenny Dehn, the Director at Head Start, stated "we can never tell you how much these gifts are appreciated. They make a BIG DIFFERENCE and bring so much fun for the kids and happiness for the parents too." We feel the same. What is Per Capita?

In the Presbyterian Church USA system of governance, each member of the congregation is assessed a *per capita* amount to support the work of the church through its three governing levels.

The per capita money is divided as follows:

Winnebago Presbytery 66%

Synod of Lakes & Prairies 14%

General Assembly 20%

The *per capita* covers the cost of operating these three separate entities, various committees, and commissions, along with funding the annual General Assembly Meeting.

Our Session has supported this assessment as an appropriate way to assist in helping to meet the needs of our denomination.

The per capita for 2024 is \$38.00 per church member. First Presbyterian Church will pay this amount regardless of whether you contribute \$38.00. Please note that per capita is separate from your usual donation or tithe.



Star Words or Gifts

Is your Star Word visible for you to see each day? What have you learned about your Star Word?

During Growing Connections, on December 31, we discussed and chose star words. As a reminder, January 6, is Epiphany - is a day in the liturgical calendar when we celebrate the magi's arrival to Jesus. The Gospel of Matthew tells us the arrival of the magi, a noble group of people, studied stars and knew when a new one appeared. The star guided them to the place of Jesus' birth.

The use of Star Words, also called "Star Gifts," is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year. This type of prayer practice has been growing in popularity, in Protestant churches, for more than a decade. Star Words are meant to direct us and guide our year - just like the bright star guiding the magi so many years ago.

The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are written or printed on paper stars. This activity allows us to pick out a star that will guide each of us throughout the coming year. Star Words can instantly make sense to us, or be a bit of a puzzle, or a mystery to us.

- Listen as people talk to you, as you watch TV/movies as you read, and pay attention to how, when, and how often your word comes up in the world around you.
- Look up your word. Write the definition in a journal if you're keeping one. Do any of the synonyms stand out to you for any reason?
- For February, cut out a paper heart and write your star word on that. Hang it where you see it often.

Do you still need to pick out a Star Word? Stop by the church office.
