

The Service of Tenebrae is an adaptation of a Fourth Century service traditionally observed on Thursday of Holy Week. The Latin word, *Tenebrae*, means *shadows* or *darkness*. The service moves from light to darkness, the candles being extinguished to symbolize the denial of the disciples and friends of Jesus. The darkness also symbolizes the darkening of the world as Jesus, the light of the world, was leaving it. Finally, upon his death, the Christ candle is extinguished.

Silence is observed as we contemplate the shock, despair, gloom, and sadness of that day and night long ago... and their meaning for our lives today. The service is phrased in words of scripture, which together with the music, speak to us of our Lord.

As each light is extinguished, let us be aware of the many ways we have denied Christ in our own lives, that the darkness of the cross might be made real for us today. As we leave this time of worship in silence, we are called to leave our moments of denial and our experiences of death at the foot of the cross, that the crucified person of Jesus Christ might share the weight of these burdens, and we might be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit into a new people, radiating with resurrection life.

*Call to Confession

The proof of God's amazing love is this: while we were sinners Christ died for us. *(Romans 5:8)*

Because we have faith in him, we dare to approach God with confidence. In faith and penitence let us confess our sin before God and one another.

*Prayer of Confession

Eternal God, whose covenant with us is never broken, we confess that we fail to fulfill your will.

Though you have bound yourself to us, we will not bind ourselves to you. In Jesus Christ you serve us freely, but we refuse your love and withhold ourselves from others. We do not love you fully or love one another as you command.

In your mercy, forgive us and cleanse us.

Lead us once again to your table and unite us to Christ, who is the bread of life and the vine from which we grow in grace.

The mercy of the Lord is from everlasting to everlasting. I declare to you, in the name of Jesus Christ, we are forgiven.

Thanks be to God.

May the God of mercy, who forgives all our sins, strengthen us in all goodness and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. **Amen.**

***Responding to God's Grace** (*A Brief Statement of Faith, 10.1, 5, 6.*) Having experienced God's grace, let us live what we have come to experience and to believe.

In life and in death we belong to God. Through the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, we trust in the one triune God, the Holy One of Israel, whom alone we worship and serve.

With believers in every time and place, we rejoice that nothing in life or in death can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. Amen.
