It was still the first day of the week. That evening, while the disciples were behind closed doors because they were afraid of the Jewish authorities, Jesus came and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. When the disciples saw the Lord, they were filled with joy. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so I am sending you." Then he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, they are forgiven; if you don't forgive them, they aren't forgiven."

Thomas, the one called Didymus, one of the Twelve, wasn't with the disciples when Jesus came. The other disciples told him, "We've seen the Lord!"

But he replied, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands, put my finger in the wounds left by the nails, and put my hand into his side, I won't believe."

After eight days his disciples were again in a house and Thomas was with them. Even though the doors were locked, Jesus entered and stood among them. He said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here. Look at my hands. Put your hand into my side. No more disbelief. Believe!"

Thomas responded to Jesus, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus replied, "Do you believe because you see me? Happy are those who don't see and yet believe."

Then Jesus did many other miraculous signs in his disciples' presence, signs that aren't recorded in this scroll. But these things are written so that you will believe that Jesus is the Christ, God's Son, and that believing, you will have life in his name.

THE NICENE CREED

Financial Gratitude and Giving

You can give online at www.fdlpresbyterian.org. (Click on 'Giving'.) You can also give by cash or check, on Sunday morning, or by mail. We are so very thankful for your contributions that help us do God's work in our church and in our community.

CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS:

Did you know that if you are over age $70 \frac{1}{2}$ you can make a charitable contribution to our church directly from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA)?

Normally, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable during the year in which they are received. Charitable contributions may be deductible if itemized on tax returns. However, by using Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), contributions can be tax-exempt instead of tax-deductible.

A QCD is a withdrawal paid by your IRA custodian directly from your account. Our church is a qualified recipient as a 501(c)(3) charitable organization.

For those who are at least age 72 (or 73 if after 12/31/22), QCDs count toward the IRA owner's current year Required Minimum Distribution (RMD). The funds must come out of the IRA by the owner's RMD deadline, generally December 31 each year. For this reason, it is helpful to plan ahead, allowing time for distributions to be processed by the IRA custodian before year-end.

Information about QCDs and conditions that apply is available online, from your IRA custodian or a tax advisor.
