In the midst of several recent conversations, I have heard people longing for us to have a more structured prayer ministry. The comments have ranged from formal prayer chains to prayer services to officially training Stephen Ministers. I truly believe that a thriving congregation is intentional about maintaining a very robust prayer ministry.

One <u>blog article from Breeze</u> (our church's database software company) shared the story of a large congregation that "had hosted a 4am Tuesday prayer service since its inception, and it was surprisingly very well attended. Yes, you read that right – 4am." While not everyone might be excited



to gather weekly at 4am, prayer is important, even critical! Jesus regularly went off alone to pray to his Father. The disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray, and he answered (see Matthew 6 and Luke 11.)

There are already many ways we engage in prayer. We have a prayer list in the bulletin and newsletter for people to be in prayer for one another. Every church meeting opens and closes with prayer. Some members meet during the week in various locations around Fond du Lac to pray. And, you may have noticed, each Sunday a small group of people, including those leading worship that day, gather by the sanctuary entrance about 8:50 am to pray for the service.

If the Holy Spirit has been placing a passion for prayer on your heart, and you are willing to commit to regularly meeting to pray, please let me know so together we can discern what intentional prayer ministries God might be calling us to explore and embrace.

Pennsylvania Church Offers Community a 'Fresh Start'

The local laundromat was Linda's chapel. It was where she first shared a prayer concern that had been weighing heavily on her mind — and on her family's heart — to say nothing of their budget.

At the time, Linda was dealing with stage 4 cancer.

She confessed to the pastor and volunteers from the <u>Presbyterian Church of Waynesboro</u>, Pennsylvania, who were gathered around Linda and her daughter, "Since I got sick, my washer and dryer can't handle the volume of blankets and bedding."

The cost of doing laundry was driving Linda's family and other families deeper into poverty. And so began the church's "Fresh Start: Loads of Love" laundry outreach program, funded in part by a grant received from the <u>Presbytery of Carlisle</u>'s portion of the <u>Peace & Global Witness Offering</u>. The presbytery grants empower congregations and individuals to become peacemakers in their communities and in the world.

Traditionally received on World Communion Sunday, the Peace & Global Witness Offering is unique in that half of it is directed to peacemaking and global witness efforts at the national church level to address critical justice issues around the world. Twenty-five percent is retained by our congregation for peace and reconciliation work, and twenty-five percent is kept by mid councils for similar ministries on the regional level.

"The Waynesboro church's laundry outreach program exemplifies the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.)'s longstanding commitment to peacemaking," said the Rev. Wilson Kennedy, the PC(USA)'s associate director for Special Offerings and Appeals. "Even the simplest tasks, like washing clothes for those on the margins of our communities, helps sow seeds of peace like Jesus commands us."

And following Jesus' commandments is integral to the mission of "Fresh Start."

The Rev. Caroline Vickery says, "We know that Jesus makes it clear that how we treat the vulnerable is how we treat Jesus. Most of our members are college-educated, literate and middle-class. Our laundry outreach has put them in touch with a world whose hardships they're unaware of. It comes as a shock for people to realize how costly doing your laundry can be and to know that people can't use their SNAP benefits to buy detergent, cleaning supplies or personal hygiene items. Not being able to keep yourself clean robs people of their dignity. There's something restorative about knowing that people will be able to be their best selves. That's why we call it 'Fresh Start.' It's a chance to start over."

"There are many other small churches who want to improve the lives of people in their communities so that the love of God can be made visible through their ministries," Vickery said. "By giving to the Peace & Global Witness Offering, people can help other small churches make God's love real — in their town and around the world.

And as we always say, when we all do a little — it adds up to a lot! Please give generously.

Let us pray~ God of Peace, even the simplest acts of love and care for another person are counted as peace to you. Thank you for showing us the way of peace in the person of Jesus, and walk with us as we work to sow seeds of peace in our world through our gifts. In Jesus' name, we pray. **Amen**.




Get ready for an exciting game of Cribbage on September 20th at 7:00 pm in Fellowship Hall.


