God's Word Is Proclaimed

First Reading: Luke 1:67-79 (Common English Bible)

(page 58 in the pew Bible, page 1244 Common English Bible)

John's father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied, "Bless the Lord God of Israel

because he has come to help and has delivered his people.

He has raised up a mighty savior for us in his servant David's house, just as he said through the mouths of his holy prophets long ago.

He has brought salvation from our enemies and from the power of all those who hate us.

He has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors, and remembered his holy covenant, the solemn pledge he made to our ancestor Abraham.

He has granted that we would be rescued from the power of our enemies so that we could serve him without fear, in holiness and righteousness in God's eyes, for as long as we live.

In the fifteenth year of the rule of the emperor Tiberius—when Pontius Pilate was governor over Judea and Herod was ruler over Galilee, his brother Philip was ruler over Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was ruler over Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas—God's word came to John son of Zechariah in the wilderness. John went throughout the region of the Jordan River, calling for people to be baptized to show that they were changing their hearts and lives and wanted God to forgive their sins. This is just as it was written in the scroll of the words of Isaiah the prophet,

A voice crying out in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way for the Lord;
make his paths straight.

Every valley will be filled,
and every mountain and hill will be leveled.

The crooked will be made straight
and the rough places made smooth.

All humanity will see God's salvation." (Isaiah 40:3-5)

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Confession of Belhar (10.7) & A Brief Statement of Faith (11.4)

We believe that God has revealed God's self as the one who wishes to bring about justice and true peace among people;

We trust in God the Holy Spirit everywhere the giver and renewer of life. In a broken and fearful world, the Spirit gives us courage to pray without ceasing, to witness among all peoples to Christ as Lord and Savior, to unmask idolatries in Church and culture, to hear the voices of peoples long silenced, and to work with others for justice, freedom, and peace.

In gratitude to God, empowered by the Spirit, we strive to serve Christ in our daily tasks and to live holy and joyful lives, even as we watch for God's new heaven and new earth, praying, "Come, Lord Jesus!"

The Confession of Belhar was emerged in the early 1980's out of the Dutch Reformed Church in South Africa in response to Apartheid. The PC(USA) approved the Confession of Belhar as part of the Book of Confessions in 2016.

A Brief Statement of Faith was written after the reunion of the UPCUSA and the PCUS in 1983, to articulate Presbyterians' common identity amidst the realities of diversity and disagreement in both the church and the world.
