## Lighting the Candle of Love

Confirmation Class

When the people were looking for deliverance, the prophet Micah declared, "But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah...from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient day." (Micah 5:2).

But what if Micah is also talking to us, proclaiming, "But you, O Presbyterians in Fond du Lac of Wisconsin, from you shall come forth for me..." What? What might God be calling forth from us?

# We Respond to God's Word

#### **AFFIRMATION OF FAITH**

#### The Confession of 1967 - Section B: The Love of God\*\*

God's sovereign love is a mystery beyond the reach of the human mind. Human thought ascribes to God superlatives of power, wisdom, and goodness. But God reveals his love in Jesus Christ by showing power in the form of a servant, wisdom in the folly of the cross, and goodness in receiving sinful humans. The power of God's love in Christ to transform the world discloses that the Redeemer is the Lord and Creator who made all things to serve the purpose of his love.

God has created humanity in a personal relation with himself that humans may respond to the love of the Creator. God expressed his love for all humankind through Israel, whom he chose to be his covenant people to serve him in love and faithfulness. Out of Israel God in due time raised up Jesus. He was the fulfillment of God's promise to Israel, the beginning of the new creation, and the pioneer of the new humanity. He gave history its meaning and direction and called the church to be his servant for the reconciliation of the world.

The reconciling work of Jesus was the supreme crisis in the life of humankind. His cross and resurrection become personal crisis and present hope for humans when the gospel is proclaimed and believed. In this experience the Spirit brings God's forgiveness to humans, moves them to respond in faith, repentance, and obedience, and initiates the new life in Christ.

The new life takes shape in a community in which humans know that God loves and accepts them in spite of what they are. They therefore accept themselves and love others, knowing that no human has any ground on which to stand, except God's grace.

<sup>\*\*</sup> In the spirit of the purpose for writing C-67 (using more contemporary language), some wordings have been edited, such as changing "man" to "humanity" for the purpose of reclaiming the corporate nature of being the people of God and the body of Christ.
