Please respect the confidentiality of the search process.

The life of every congregation is punctuated by the coming and going of key leaders and program staff; and the professional life of many program staff is punctuated by changes in congregations who employ them. For both the congregation and the staff person, it is important for these transitions to take place in as healthy a manner as possible.

Program staff and congregations form unique personal bonds and relationships during their time of ministry together. When a staff relationship is concluded, it is understandable that the staff and members of the congregation would like to stay in touch and continue the relationship they have enjoyed. However, doing so makes it more difficult for congregations to begin forming new bonds and relationships with their future staff. Therefore, the Personnel Team of First Presbyterian Church, rejects any official activities which invade any other current staff person's role without a specific invitation from the Head of Staff, or in their absence, the Clerk of Session.

The Personnel Team opposes any fostering of informal relationships in the congregation, which, in the perception of the current Head of Staff or Session, harms the ministry of the current staff. This is particularly applicable to social media/on-line interaction. The departing staff member should exercise discipline to find ways to remove undue social media visibility that would invade the ministry of the current staff.

## Changes to the Start of Worship

During the past few months, the Worship Team has been discussing several theological questions, including:

- What do our actions say about our faith?
- When does our worship service begin and end?
- What does the entrance and exit of the light of Christ lantern signify?
- What is the purpose of the prelude and the postlude?
- Are the announcements part of worship?
- What does the tolling of the bell signify?

We decided to experiment with slightly changing the way we begin our worship service, and we invite you to reflect on how these changes may impact your worship experience.

During the prelude, the acolyte will carry the Light of Christ forward, symbolically illuminating the path for the Pastor and Liturgist. At the end of the prelude, the handbells will ring, marking the 9:00 hour.

During the final hymn, the Light of Christ symbolically goes out into the world, calling us to follow, reflecting God's presence to the world.

Vitamin C aids in iron absorption so taking iron with orange juice, grapefruit juice, cherry juice or tomato juice are good choices. You have over a month to prepare for a successful donation, make good use of it!

Remember, you can donate one unit of blood every 56 days. One hour of your time every 56 days could save a life. Is that too much to ask?


