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## Reflections

#### The Practice of Giving Thanks

<sup>26:1</sup> When you have come into the land that the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, <sup>2</sup>you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the Lord your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. 3You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, 'Today I declare to the Lord your God that I have come into the land that the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us.' 4When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the Lord your God, <sup>5</sup>you shall make this response before the Lord your God: 'A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. 6When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, <sup>7</sup>we cried to the Lord, the God of our ancestors; the Lord heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. <sup>8</sup>The Lord brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; <sup>9</sup>and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. <sup>10</sup>So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me.' You shall set it down before the Lord your God and bow down before the Lord your God.

Deuteronomy 26:1-10

The practice of giving thanks is the act of pausing to recognize the gifts that God has given us, and where they originated. Giving an offering to God is not just about financing the programs to which we give money. While that help is crucial to the ministry and work that provides care throughout the world, the act of giving thanks is necessary in order to have a healthy relationship with God and being thankful for the blessings we receive. As the passage from Deuteronomy goes on to say, if we do not take time to return thanks to God, we begin to suffer the illusion that it is by our own strength and work that we have the blessings we enjoy. Thinking in that manner means it is by our own strength and work that we will be able to sustain all the good things, as well. It's all up to us. If we experience loss or hardship it is our fault. If others are less fortunate, we begin to see them as not being as good as us. That type of attitude alienates us from others and causes us to feel anxious about our need to constantly keep in control or, suffer everything spinning out of control. We become judgmental of those who are in need and fearful about our own limitations. Our world becomes a frightening, dangerous place.

If we are consistent in practicing the discipline of giving thanks, we become aware that many others are part of our story. Our good fortune is a result of God's steadfast love and the many good people who have supported us along the way. We live in the blessings that our forebearers envisioned for us. In the same way, we will offer thanks so as to provide for our children and grand-children who will come after us.

Giving thanks connects us with our history in a healthy and joyful way. Take time during the season of Thanksgiving to tell family stories, to recount the blessings and the ways in which God intervened when there were difficult or frightening times.

Take time to give thanks.

What is each person's labor in the work of restoring our community and our nation? How do we motivate one another to labor on God's behalf?

#### 11/24/2019

Sermon: "Christians Follow Christ"

Theme: God calls those who are faithful to place their relationship with Christ and faithful-

ness to serve above all other commitments and distractions.

Purpose: To examine what it means to make Christ the center of our life, and make a com-

mitment to what is the center of our faith.

Scriptures: Jeremiah 23:1-6 Woe to the shepherds who scatter the sheep and do not

practice righteousness.

Colossians 1:11-20 Be strong in the strength of the power that comes from God

in Christ.

#### Questions:

In what ways does our personal faith in Christ affect our commitments to our family, our church, and to the world? How do we faithfully develop relationships which reflect Christ's love? How do we avoid falling prey to serving our own egos or interpreting our selfishness into God's call? What do we need to do in order to put Christ's gift of forgiveness first in our ways of speaking and acting towards others? What is it we need to practice regularly as Christians in order to be more focused on Christ than upon the fears and worries that often begin to dominate our thinking?

# Coming Up in Worship (continued)

#### 12/01/2019

Sermon: "Wake Up!"

Theme: We need to focus on the gift of God's presence and wisdom in order to make the most of

this time.

Purpose: To call the congregation to dedication to daily preparation for Christ's presence.

Scriptures: Isaiah 2:1-5 The people seek to come to the wisdom of God.

Romans 13:11-14 Wake up! Put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no room

for the flesh.

#### Questions:

What keeps us from fully appreciating the gift of Christ's love in Advent and Christmas? What are the distractions that rob us of the joy and wonder of the season? How is it our grievances, unforgiveness, and fears lead us to denial, distraction, and focus upon things that are meaningless? Why do we focus on the things we cannot control, while neglecting to take time for the growth and wisdom that would become a source of strength?

#### 12/08/2019

Sermon: "Make Peace (Get Over It!)"

Theme: It's time to release our attachment to past wounds, grievances, and complaints so that we

may experience the welcome and acceptance that Jesus wants to share with us.

Purpose: The congregation will begin to examine what past issues are being used for self-

justification and propping up identity.

Scriptures: Isaiah 11:1-10 The presence of Christ is coming to create reconciliation

and healing for all who will open themselves to the

knowledge of God.

Romans 15:4-13 Those who welcome others as Christ has welcomed us find

joy, forgiveness and healing.

#### **Ouestions:**

What does it take to enable us to make a commitment to releasing our past wounds and complaints? Why do we hold onto and relive hurts, conflicts, and issues from the past? What is it that causes us to make our wounds and hurts central to the way in which we see ourselves? What would it take for us to let go of those things? How can we see ourselves as part of God's love and redeeming work in the world? What do we need to do in order to open our hearts to healing, especially in the places that have long been painful?

#### 12/15/2019 Cantata at 10:30 Service.

Sermon: "Reach Out!!"

Theme: God has given us a time for proclaiming peace both in our own lives and in the lives of the

people who are around us.

Purpose: We will participate together in seeking ways we can build and share the peace that is God's

will.

Scriptures: Isaiah 35:1-10 God is making a way of healing and reconciliation, inviting all

of us to participate in welcoming the renewal.

James 5:7-10 Practice patience and release the grudges that separate us

from God.

#### **Ouestions:**

What happens to us when we become part of reaching out in love to others? How are we enabled to grow and see ourselves differently when we are participating in God's love and grace flowing to others? What do we need to do in order to redirect our complaining and grumbling into reaching out in love and celebration of peace? How do we practically begin to work for peace rather than live in defensiveness and hostility? How do we find the place where we can reach out in love and serve Christ?



## South Sudan Flooding

"Recent information about South Sudan has been received regarding severe flooding that occurred during October and culminating on October 25th, leaving 800,000 people affected and without aid for several weeks. Air fields were flooded and aid from the UN is just beginning to arrive a of November 8.

More than 400,000 people are thought to have lost their homes following heavy seasonal rains that have hit much of the region. Pibor, in the east of the country, is one of the places that has been worst hit. Many have been forced into flimsy shelters clinging to tiny bits of land that have not been submerged. Houses have been destroyed and crops have been washed away in heavy rain since July, according to correspondence from PRDA.

In South Sudan, Presbyterian
Disaster Assistance (PDA) is
working with the Presbyterian
Relief and Development Agency
(PRDA), an arm of the Presbyterian
Church of South Sudan, to
provide food and non-food items
as well as assistance with shelter,
said Dayna Oliver, PDA's associate
for international program administration."
