"Leaving Behind Fear and Worry"

²⁵ 'Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? ²⁸And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. ³⁰But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? ³¹Therefore do not worry, saying, "What will we eat?" or "What will we drink?" or "What will we wear?" ³²For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. ³³But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

Matthew 6:25-34

Anxiousness and fear are increasingly dominating our society and culture, leading people to seek security in methods that lead to more isolation and fear. Dividing ourselves off and keeping people out seems like a way to prevent being hurt. But, during loneliness and separation we find ourselves more worried and afraid. We seek to create security through wealth but then fear losing that wealth. We seek to find comfort and strength in people who can protect us, but far too often our protectors become those who dominate and take over. The short form is that the confidence and peace, that comes from outside of ourselves, may also become the source of greater fear and uncertainty. Real confidence can only come from knowing that God abides with an expectation of steadfast care and sustaining grace.

In the passage from the Sermon on the Mount Jesus is being more practical than we often perceive, if we open our minds to the message. Jesus is saying that the universe is not out to get us; quite the opposite – the default setting of life is for sustenance and wholeness. God has placed a blessing over all things that is greater than the forces that corrupt and harm. Our expectation can be of dread and of disaster, however, that will lead to a constant perception of threats and disasters lurking just outside our control. Or, we can see through eyes of faith which cause us to know that problems exist to be solved. God is still in control. Our job is not to control everything in order to be safe, but to know confidence through the Kingdom of God and God's unending care.

Part of what makes this challenging is the increasing use of fear, in our society, to motivate others and influence society. Whether it is the news of random acts of terrorists or pharmaceutical ads that suggest you are in desperate need of medication to prevent your demise, or politicians that tell you that their opponent is out to destroy you, threats are in abundance. The answer is neither to detach from the world or to try and find a source of power that will make us secure. The answer is to dwell in the knowledge of God who will sustain us. We will find peace in the knowledge of God and Christ's love.

This is the goal of our upcoming Lenten season: to walk a path that leads us away from fear into a place of strength, through confidence in Christ's love and God's care. We will use our time of Lenten disciplines, studies, and conversations on this journey. We begin with Ash Wednesday February 26th at 6:30 and go into April when we celebrate what it means to live as resurrection Christians. Join us for this time of healing and renewal.

PerCapita Payment

Each year we make a payment to the Presbyterian denomination, via the Presbytery. It is an expense, per member of the church, that is known as PerCapita (per head). The PerCapita amount this year, is again \$37.00/person.

This money is divided as follows:

• 18% is used to support the work of the General Assembly

administering disaster relief funds,

supporting Leisa Wagstaff, an aid worker in South Sudan, whom we have been coming to know

a wide range of other programs

• 12% is used to supports the Synod

funds Synod School

other programs to maintain missions throughout the region

• 70% supports the Presbytery

staff to assist the churches

Some members choose to provide an extra gift at the beginning of the calendar year to off-set their own PerCapita payment, which is greatly appreciated. That additional gift of \$37.00 per member, in the household, allows us to pay our donation to the denomination while dedicating our other gifts to our missions and work of being Christians – Serving, Learning and Loving.



Embracing the Uncertain: A Lenten Study for Unsteady Times By Magrey Devega Paperback \$11.00

Just turning on the news lets us know we are living in uncertain times. Economic instabilities, eruptions of violence, and natural catastrophes can alter the lives and landscapes of entire communities. Our individual lives are often just as unsteady: relationships can break, plans can falter, and confidence can fail.

Uncertainty can definitely be uncomfortable. Many of us prefer stability and a predictable future to an unknown fate. We are wired to want to control our destiny.



The reality is that in our fast-changing, unpredictable world there are few guarantees in life. It's those who are willing to embrace uncertainty and make the risky decision to follow Jesus despite the many "unknowns" who will reap the greatest rewards.

During Lent we will engage and wrestle with life's uncertainties, not ignore them. The first six chapters focus on six post-Transfiguration, pre-Passion stories in the Gospels. Each of these stories are signposts in the gospel narrative, pointing down at a world filled with uncertainty, but pointing us forward to a cross that can show us how to follow Jesus with courage, hope and obedience.

It is official! Leisa Wagstaff will be in Fond du Lac on March 21 and 22. Please save the date for a community event tentatively planned for Saturday morning. First Presbyterian is hosting Leisa for worship and education hour on Sunday, March 22.

Join us in listening, learning and becoming inspired by the Journey of Hope found in Leisa's global mission work. She says, "I serve as your representative, your mission co-worker, and the embodiment of your desire to share the good news of Jesus Christ in every corner of the earth."

After nearly 30 years as a mission co-worker, Leisa helps the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan (PCOSS) strengthen its educational min-

istry by facilitating the repair and construction of primary schools, developing in-service teacher training programs, and nurturing community participation in education. Statistics show that 70% of children between the ages of six and seventeen have never set foot inside a classroom, only 25% of the school age population is enrolled in school, and almost 90% of teachers are untrained.

Leisa invites everyone to share in this ministry alongside her and our global partners.

Isaiah 43:1b-2a




April 19 - Student Bibles
