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Reflections

"It's a Marathon, Not a Sprint"

¹² Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, ¹³ and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint, but rather be healed. ¹⁴ Pursue peace with everyone, and the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. ¹⁵See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springs up and causes trouble, and through it many become defiled.

Hebrews 12:12-15

The Letter to the Hebrews was written after the fall of Jerusalem, to the Jewish Christians who were displaced and struggling in the Roman world. Many Jewish families had already moved into the various parts of the Roman world years before the destruction of Jerusalem. They were, at the time this was written, unexpectedly supporting and caring for extended family that were living with them, as refugees. This letter was written long after the destruction and it is clear, nerves are wearing thin. What was given immediately as support was now being reconsidered. Many were beginning to question their generosity.

We are coming to a point in our Coronavirus experience where character matters and the kind of maturity we have developed in Christ begins to show. Most of us have been able to develop patterns for our daily lives that solve most of the major problems – getting food on the table, communication, and care. We are, however, tiring of the things that have become repetitive and unsatisfying. This is the time when our commitment to Christ shows in the way we speak and act.

Most of us are dealing with various kinds of loss and fear. We have lost events we looked forward to enjoying. We have lost time with family and with friends. Many of us have lost income, assets, and above all we have lost our sense of security. We have dealt with irritations and troubles. Some of us have to fight battles with bureaucracy, being on "hold", and struggling with electronic communication, that is really fraying our nerves. So how can we be "Christians" in moments like these?

Those who embrace their relationship with Christ will frequently repeat to themselves:

- I am not the center of this, and I am here to do what I can, where I can, when I can.
- God's love is for me at this time and my struggles are known. God accepts me as I am, limits and all.
- Everyone is doing the best they can at their particular level of capability and strength.

This may seem simplistic and superficial but bear with me: this is the foundation upon which meaningful relationships with Christ are built.

Everyone is dealing with unfamiliar complications that make what was routine more difficult. It is frustrating as we are deal with "electronic" phone systems that require us to put in the same number countless time. On the other side of that electronic pain in the neck, is another human who is getting the output. And, that output has been made a lot more complicated.

In many cases we are dealing with people whose families have been completely disrupted, incomes have been challenged, and they are either trying to figure out how to do their jobs in a new environment and new timetable, or they are out of work worrying about their finances, or possibly both. Keep in mind many "essential workers" are happy to have the gratitude, but what they would really appreciate is a raise in salary so they can afford to pay their bills and have decent health care. Reflections (Continued)

Your faith in Christ is shown in how you choose to view the challenges we face. This is especially true with so much uncertainty as to when "normal" will be restored, and the losses people have sustained are evaluated. The fight of a marathon (I am told, I will admit) is to focus on "the run" and not on the "race." To focus on the run is to be mindful of the rhythm and movement of the race, rather than to be overwhelmed by the discomfort, fatigue, and distance. We are in a place where those who are mature in their faith in Christ continue to see themselves as a part of the work of God in the world. We don't see the issues and problems in front of us. We don't feel disconnected from the people with whom we will need to interact. A healthy, mature Christian is thoughtful of his/her needs, challenges, and issues, but is in balance with the needs, challenges, and issues of the people who are around us.

So, strengthen the weak knees, and lift the drooping hands. We've got a ways to go but we are loved by God and blessed. Every step we take, God and a cloud of witnesses is cheering us on. We have been promised that Christ will transform our sorrow and suffering into joy and peace.

Purpose: The congregation will seek to practice humility, forgiveness, and acceptance of our

current situation.

Scriptures: 1 Peter 1:17-23 Living in the time of exile, being purified by the obedience of

faith.

Luke 24:13-35 The Walk to Emmaus where Jesus appears to the disciples.

Questions:

How does Jesus appear to us today? How does Jesus' resurrection become apparent to us, particularly when we are experience fear or struggles? How can we be resurrection focused rather than distracted by our own issues? General Guidelines For All Scholarships

If you would like to participate in the First Presbyterian Church Scholarship program, the following criteria must be met:

- 1. Recipient must be a member of this church.
- 2. Recipient must have demonstrated a commitment to the church. This commitment has been defined as meeting the following criteria in the past calendar year:
 - Church worship attendance a minimum of twice in the past calendar year.
 - Nurturing your faith development in an activity of the Serving, Learning or Loving Teams (educational opportunities, mission activities, worship participation, etc.) at least twice in the past calendar year.
- 3. Recipient is enrolled in an accredited college or university.
- 4. The <u>application form</u> is available online. It should be completed and submitted electronically by May 1, 2020.

Interviews with all applicants may be scheduled to complete the process.

It is with great sadness that I am informing you that we are cancelling the Fond du Lac Feed My Starving Children MobilePack 2020 event, due to the COVID-19 virus. Feed My Starving Children has automatically cancelled the event, so volunteers do not need to do anything. Our greatest concern is for the safety of our volunteers, FMSC staff and food recipients. Please continue to pray for the health and safety for all, but especially for the vulnerable during this difficult time.

We have begun planning for the 2021 event. We are looking at dates in March or May. (April is booked up at the Fairgrounds.) We will keep you posted on these details. The donations collected for 2020 will automatically rollover to 2021. Individuals can also continue to make donations using the 2020 website, if they desire.

FMSC has closed all packing sites and cancelled all MobilePack events for April. There is discussion about remaining closed for May, also. Meanwhile, one of our ingredient vendors has agreed to pack food on behalf of FMSC. Praise God for his faithfulness! Please continue to keep this ministry in your prayers.
