Reflections

Real Wisdom

¹³ Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. ¹⁴But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. ¹⁵Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. ¹⁶For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. ¹⁷But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. ¹⁸And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. James 3:13-18

The continuing conflicts, quarrels, and fights of the pandemic have worn on most of us. However, many times it is only after people have had to persevere through difficulties that their ability to grow in relationships begins to shine. Increasingly, we see families around us who have been decompensating. This means that they are losing their ability to adapt and are becoming increasingly hostile, condemning, and toxic. At the same time, others are becoming more creative, caring, and thoughtful. There are some practices that make the difference.

Those who are giving into their "devilish" nature – as James would describe it – are increasing their focus on their hostility, exhaustion, and fear. This takes place as people mentally rerun unresolved conflicts in their minds; as they continue to focus on narratives of the wrongs that some have done to them, and as they focus on what is missing or wrong in their lives. The wisdom from above is seen in individuals who are intentional about giving one another healthy space. Remember, conflict in relationships occurs more frequently from too much closeness, rather than too much distance. This is particularly difficult when people do not have their usual places to "talk things through" with friends, or don't have the ability to put their issues into perspective. The healthier among us are intentional about developing and participating in practices that help restore perspective. This wisdom helps us to see the difference between an unfortunate exchange and an unforgivable offense.

One of the key lessons of wisdom is that we sow what we plant. This is particularly true as we are all living in smaller spaces these days. If we attempt to plant control, resentment, and retaliation, we can anticipate a greater harvest of hostility, aggression, and bitterness. Instead, we need to work to plant generosity, acceptance, welcome, and love. These traits will produce a harvest of mutual support, healthy humor, and love for one another.

For what they are worth, here are a couple tips for wisdom in a smaller space. First, speak less. Seldom do more words communicate more meaning. If we spend more time thinking about what we say, rather than defending what we said, we will be in better shape. Secondly, be generous with one another in giving space and support. In conjunction with that, care about the space in which you live as a place of welcome for yourself and those with you. We take the people, who live with us, for granted and forget that we need to extend hospitality to them, as well as our guests. Lastly, we aren't going to make it without building our spiritual foundation. Without a source of confidence in God's love for us, and God's approval of us as beloved and valuable children, we can't extend that same care to others.

The good news is that all things *do* work together for good for those who love God and who align themselves with Christ's teaching. The Holy Spirit is working with us through this time and it is amazing the way the right resources and support pop up right when we need them the most.

Trust God and give thanks to Jesus that we are going to make it through this.

Session Highlights

Session has been meeting regularly during the pandemic, via Zoom. Our meetings always contain discussion about how we can keep everybody safe while still providing meaningful worship opportunities. Most church business is continuing during the shutdown. Session has been coping with the concerns, on a monthly basis.

Some of the items recently accomplished by Session are as follows:

- Created a Transition Team that will work with church staff and Session to help sort out issues relative to the Corona Virus, both during the shutdown and when we re-open.
- Approved a motion from the Deacons to hold a "Virtual Cookie Walk" with the proceeds to support the Deacon's Compassion Fund.
- Approved a motion from the Serve Team to allocate \$2,000 from the Martha Anderson Funds to help with the needs of the Fond du Lac Food Pantry.
- Approved a motion from the Serve Team to allocate \$1,000 from mission money to help support Presbyterian Disaster Assistance who, in turn, is helping those who have been effected by the wildfires on the West Coast.
- Approved a six month budget to guide the church through the end of the year, during these uncertain economic conditions. A twelve month budget is in development and expected to come to Session in November.

fidence and joy for our lives.

Matthew 15:1-9 Pharisees and scribes come to criticize the practices

of Jesus and the disciples. Jesus points out their hy-

pocrisy.

Questions:

What does it mean to us in a spiritual sense to "fear the Lord?" How do we develop an attitude that is healthy and wise towards our spiritual life? What is essential in building a healthy relationship with God? What are the things that we fail to recognize in our relationship with God? What is the purpose of religion in our lives? How do we create a meaningful religious life?

With that in mind, the Team recommended to Session that \$2,000 be taken from the Martha Anderson Endowment Fund and donated to the Fond du Lac Food Pantry.

The Food Pantry is located next to the Holiday Inn on Rolling Meadows Drive. (Many of us will recognize the building as the old Shakey's Pizza building.) The Pantry has a drop box outside the facility so there is no need to enter the building. (See photos)

Since we cannot hold a regular food drive, the Team is asking all church members to donate the most needed items:

toilet paper peanut butter macaroni and cheese

Monetary donations are always welcome.

If you want to donate toilet paper, it would be best if you dropped it off Monday -Thursday, as the drop box is emptied at 9:00 every weekday morning. (A donation over the weekend might stress the capacity of the drop box.)

The Western Wildfires

In carrying out our mission work, our church has always divided its efforts between serving the local Fond du Lac community and helping fill national and international needs.

At this time, there are a great many people on the west coast who are in need, because of the raging wild fires that devasted communities in that area.


