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"Learning to Live with our Fear"

¹⁷Love has been perfected among us in this: that we may have boldness on the day of judgement, because as he is, so are we in this world. ¹⁸There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love.

1 John 4:17-18

Most of us remember the quote from FDR "So, first of all, let me assert my firm belief that the only thing we have to fear is...fear itself — nameless, unreasoning, unjustified terror which paralyzes needed efforts to convert retreat into advance." President Roosevelt's circumstances meant that the fear was to not move with boldness against an over-whelming threat. Our issue is that people are moving out of fear, often with boldness. In our case, our biggest fear is for people to not be reckless, as they live with their anxiety.

One of the problems is that some of our fears are invisible. Some of those invisible things are very real, however, like viruses and hatred. Some of those unseen things are unreal such as conspiracy theories and falsehoods. One of the traits we need is to question and discern what is true and factual. Then, with legitimate concern, to choose what is the appropriate level of risk for our lives.

Nearly a year ago I was introduced to the term "risk budget." This is not a financial budget, but a personal level of risk for which one may engage safely and comfortably. I tend to be interested in statistics and probabilities, so this immediately made sense to me. As you look at activities and plans, you can calculate your probability of exposure to various risks (in the case of the webinar I was viewing, it was the spread of Covid-19). Then you must determine the level of risk with which you feel comfortable – 5% or 10% exposure. What I have come to realize is that this is the source of so much of the stress many of us are feeling. We know that we have had times that our exposure has been more than what our comfort for risk allows. A simple way to say this is that our lack of control occasionally causes us to feel vulnerable and powerless. What makes this interesting is that our experience of being out of control tends to last beyond the time that we experienced the risk. So, even when we are safe, it's going to take some time to feel secure again.

This disparity is hitting a great number of us at this time. We are slowly finding it safer to do more activities, but the majority of people are not rushing into them. We can safely gather with other vaccinated people in small groups, but many are reluctant to do so. There is a strong indication that while some are ready to move back to engaging in more activity, many people are not ready to take those steps.

What many people do not realize is the time and preparation required to produce our virtual presence, particularly the YouTube videos and Zoom experiences. We are trying to transition to a blended presence: maintaining our virtual ministry, for those less eager to return to church, while introducing some in-person worship, in the near future. The logistics of worshipping together will be much simpler when the vaccination rate has reached 75%, which is forecasted to be the beginning of July. That means that Sunday, July 4, 2021 has been selected as our tentative target date, to worship in the sanctuary.

In the meantime, please keep the church and its leadership in prayer. We have managed to remain strong and have been able to expand the church's ministry this past year. We have fared much better than many of our sister congregations and have had success in developing our virtual ministry. We are now trying to figure out how to maintain at least some virtual presence that will continue to be effective and meaningful (which requires a significant number of hours of work) and to restore in-person worship that will be safe, while meeting the needs of our congregation.

We believe that through the gift of the Holy Spirit and God's grace we will be successful.


members, on that day, if sales are at least \$500.


