Pastor Transition Team

The Pastor Transition Team has been gathering information on the roles and responsibilities that need to be addressed with Pastor Jack's retirement approaching. Two committees have been formed to assist us:

- Pulpit Supply Committee
- Transitional Pastor Nominating Committee

Beginning Sunday, October 3, the Pulpit Supply Committee will invite guest pastors to lead our in-person worship services, until we find a transitional pastor. Once the Transitional Pastor Nominating Committee has found a transitional pastor, he/she will serve as our pastor until we hire a permanent pastor.

To help us during this time of transition and to keep continuity with our current format, beginning Sunday, October 3, the First Presbyterian Church of Wausau is welcoming us to share in their worship services. They offer a virtual livestream service at 10:00am each Sunday, and they offer YouTube services for those of you who prefer to watch services, at your leisure. 




