Transitional/Interim Pastor Nominating Committee

The Ministry Information Form, which describes our church and what we are looking for in a transitional pastor, was presented to session for approval. Session approved the form as did the Winnebago Presbytery Commission on Ministry. The contents of the form were then entered into a computer database that is managed by the Presbyterian Church, USA. The computer program searches for pastors who have entered Pastor Information Forms (PIF's) into the same database and looks for matches. Six pastors were identified through this process as being possible matches for our church. One other candidate was brought to our attention directly through email.

The Transitional Pastor Nominating Committee has reviewed all of the applicants that have been received to date. Two of them were eliminated from further consideration for various reasons. Three of the applicants were chosen to be interviewed by the committee. Since then, one of those applicants withdrew his name from consideration. Currently two candidates are scheduled for interviews after Thanksgiving.

The interviews will be conducted using Zoom in a hybrid fashion, meaning some of the people involved in the interviews will meet in the church while others, including the candidates, will be connected to the meeting using Zoom. Worship Coordinator, Kris Bartelt has been instrumental in helping the committee set up this type of meeting.

The committee is hopeful one of the two candidates to be interviewed works out. If not, we will reconsider the other applicants or wait for more applicants to surface. There are 9 other churches in the Presbytery looking for pastors, so there are a lot of openings with relatively few candidates. We ask all to pray for the church so can find a suitable transitional pastor, in a timely manner.

Advent Begins November 28

What is the true meaning of Advent?

Advent means 'Coming' in Latin. This is the coming of Jesus into the world. Christians use the four Sundays and weeks of Advent to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas.

What is the history and use of the Advent wreath?

The Advent wreath visually marks the time leading up to Christmas and symbolizes the increasing light as Christ draws near to us. The use of such wreaths began as a family devotional practice in German homes in the 1600s. Widespread liturgical use only dates to the middle of the 20th century.

Each of the four purple candles around the periphery of the wreath marks one of the Sundays in Advent; the white Christ candle in the center is lit on Christmas Eve. Some Advent wreaths include a pink candle. This custom can be traced to medieval practice that set aside the third Sunday in Lent (and later, Advent) as an occasion of joy and a respite from the rigors of the penitential season.

Over the years, some have attached particular interpretations to individual candles, such as shepherds, angels, wise men and Mary; or hope, faith, love and joy. Far more important than any direct correlation of a candle to a special meaning, however, is our growing celebration of Jesus' birth and anticipation of Christ's coming again.

CURRENT OPPORTUNITIES

FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES

Alternative Gift Fair -The Alternative Gift Fair offers us the opportunity to reach out to our community, and the world. We are able to share God's love by giving to those who are in need. This year we will emphasize: [St. Katharine Drexel Shelter](#), [Sleep in Heavenly Peace](#), and [Water Mission](#). Materials explaining the important work that is accomplished through these organization will be presented during Advent.

Loaves and Fishes - On Monday, December 13 our church will prepare a meal for families in need. The success of this mission relies solely on volunteers. If you would like to help, please contact Lisa Warntjes or Jennifer Zander. We would love your help!

Christmas Joy Offering - This offering will be taken at Christmas time. It supports Presbyterian Mission efforts.

Feed My Starving Children - Planning is underway for an April 2nd MobilePack event. A "Have a Heart" campaign will be conducted in February to raise funds that will purchase ingredients and cover expenses for the food pack.

November 22 - Thanksgiving Mission 2021

For many years, our Thanksgiving Mission has been to provide food for individuals and families who receive services at the Fond du Lac County Department of Community Programs (DCP), the local public mental health center (459 East 1st Street).

The people we serve have been diagnosed with what is known as "severe and persistent" mental illness. Almost all our recipients live at the poverty level. They live on SSI and Medicaid benefits. Some families have children.

We shop for the usual Thanksgiving fare, of course. Once we've shopped, we go to DCP, sort everything, bag it up and label it. The thank you notes we receive are overwhelmingly touching.

This year \$500 has been set aside by Session, to help purchase the food. To cover the rest of the cost of the "Food Bags", monetary donations would be greatly appreciated. Envelopes are available on the table outside the sanctuary. Please remember to indicate "Thanksgiving Bags" on them.

The shopping date is Monday, November 22 at 9:00am, at Festival Foods. There is a [Sign-Up sheet](#) in the Narthex, for those who are interested in helping. It is a blessing to participate in the joy and success of this special mission.



Two things to remember:

1. We will continue the virtual sign-up process.
2. Our delivery date to Head Start will be Monday, December 13th.

Here's what to do:

- Signing up is easy, needing only name and phone number. Access the list of gift items via our website:

www.fdlpresbyterian.org

- New this year, someone will be available on Sundays, with a computer, to help navigate signing up and choosing gift recipients.
- Pay particular attention to the number(s) and letter(s) on the tags you choose (like 2B or 51C, etc.). Write the number and letter in **BIG** print and attach them **SECURELY** to your gifts. This information is extremely important, as it identifies the gift recipient. Do this before delivering your gifts to church.
- Enjoy your shopping. Involve your children. (We have been told, on the news, that some toys will not be available. Just do your best.)
- Gifts should be unwrapped.
- Donations of wrapping paper, tape and bows are also appreciated.

Decorating the Angel Tree

Once you sign up for your gift, either virtually or at church, choose an available ornament and attach it to the Angel Tree. We will “dress the tree” together to express our joy in giving to Head Start children and their families.

- 1) Bring your unwrapped gifts and put under the tree, as usual.
- 2) Drop-off your gifts at the church on **Friday, December 10 from 5:00-6:00pm** or **Saturday, December 11 from 10:00-11:00am**.

Alternative Gift Fair - Water Mission

They have received a four-star (the highest possible) rating from Charity Navigator. 


