## Season of Ordinary Time



Each part of the liturgical year has either a special season or is in 'ordinary time'. A special season are things like: Lent, Easter, Advent, and Christmas. Whenever the Church isn't celebrating one of these, it is Ordinary Time.

Each of these seasons begins with a time of preparation and anticipation followed by a time of celebration. A season designated as Ordinary Time follows each cycle.

The word "ordinary" here does not mean "routine" or "not special." Instead, it refers to the "ordinal numbers" (first, second, third, etc.) used to name and count the Sundays (such as the Third Sunday after Epiphany). This term comes from the Latin *ordinalis*, meaning "numbered" or "ordered," and *tempus ordinarium*, "measured time."

The first period of Ordinary Time, called the Season after Epiphany, begins on Epiphany Day and ends on the day before Ash Wednesday (the beginning of Lent). The central theme of this season is the calling of disciples and the early ministry of Jesus.<sup>1</sup>

The color of green is appropriate because it is the most ordinary color in our natural environment.<sup>2</sup>

## Per Capita

In the Presbyterian Church USA system of governance, each member of the congregation is assessed a *per capita* amount to support the work of the church through its three governing levels.

The per capita money is divided as follows:

Winnebago Presbytery - 66% Synod of Lakes & Prairies - 14% General Assembly (the national ruling body) - 20%

This *per capita* covers the cost of operating these three separate entities, various committees, and commissions, along with funding the annual General Assembly Meeting.

Our congregation has supported this assessment as an appropriate way to assist in helping to meet the needs of our denomination.

For 2022, the per capita amount is \$37.00 for each church member. First Presbyterian Church will pay this amount regardless of whether you contribute. The per capita amount is a separate charge from the money you have pledged, to the church, for its operations.

# Thanksgiving Bags - Thank You 2021

On November 22nd we were delighted to return to Festival Foods to load up our carts for individuals and families where there is serious mental illness.

This year we had 11 single individuals and 5 families, a total of 17 adults and 12 children. We transported the traditional Thanksgiving-style food to the Day Treatment Program at the Fond du lac County Department of Community Programs (DCP), unpacked, sorted, repacked into labeled bags and turned them over to staff. Outreach workers take them directly to the recipients. This year we received two written thank you notes from recipients.

After not being able to provide the baskets, last year, our contact person from DCP, reports that the bags were received with great appreciation. For the first time, one of our single individuals, invited a friend to share the meal. Linda says the actual bags are only a part of the project. The rest has to do with the anticipation of being remembered, of having our congregation faithfully provide good food, loving thoughts and thankfulness for all of us: those who give and those who receive.

This mission is just one of the many joys of sharing and serving others in our church activities. With the Thanksgiving Bags we are able to continue to follow our mission, "serving, living, loving" together.
