My Beloved -

I am so very happy to be writing you this short note. For weeks I have been looking forward to being with you. I would be glad to sit at your kitchen table and hear all about your life. If you cannot be vaccinated, I would be glad to meet you somewhere where we can safely keep our distance. Though it seems to be rapidly declining, Covid is still a fact of life, and I would hate to inadvertently expose anyone. Thank you for understanding.

In my spare time I enjoy cooking spicy foods, walking outdoors, exploring new towns and states, reading good mysteries, and listening to podcasts. I am married to the wonderful, expert packer Elizabeth Lindsey. She and our basset, William, are keeping the home-fires burning at our house in Indianapolis.

This 40-day period is a time to reflect, fast, and give penance in preparation for the resurrection of Christ, on Easter Sunday.

Beginning Wednesday, March 2 Ash Wednesday Ending


Sunday, April 17 Easter Sunday

The goal of this group study will be to focus on spiritual lessons and to recognize how the seemingly ordinary can reveal the extraordinary presence of God in our lives.

Fond du Lac MobilePack Friday and Saturday, April 1-2, 2022 Fond du Lac Fairgrounds Rec Building

So much changed in 2020–21, however Feed My Starving Children's commitment stayed true to feeding God's children - hungry in body and spirit. We are excited to announce **Friday and Saturday, April 1** - 2, 2022 as the dates of the next Fond du Lac MobilePack.

Your efforts and contributions are even more critical in these unprecedented times. At this point, the global pandemic, and its economic impact, have left 265 million people on the brink of



starvation. (Undernourished children are more susceptible to infectious diseases, like COVID-19.)

Feed My Starving Children resumed MobilePack events in June 2021, with new safety protocols in place. There is a health screen questionnaire, and physical distancing and masking requirement. You will be assigned to a small group and will stay with that same group during the entire process from orientation, to packing to the closing prayer.

Due to these new safety protocols, we have changed our regular packing schedule. The schedule this year will be:

• Friday, April 1	Set Up and MobilePack 3:30-5:00pm Set Up 6:00-8:00pm Packing Session
• Saturday, April 2	MobilePack and Clean Up 9:00-11:00am Packing Session 12:30-2:30pm Packing Session 3:00-5:30pm Clean Up

Our goal for 2022 is to pack 101,088 meals! The cost of these meals is \$25,000. Each meal costs about 25 cents so every donation makes a huge impact. A donation of \$88 will feed a child for an entire year. At this point, we have raised \$5,000 towards our goal.

During the month of February, churches throughout our area are participating in the **Have a Heart Campaign to** raise the \$25,000 needed for this year's Fond du Lac MobilePack. Take one of the hearts and a self-addressed envelopes from the tree in the narthex, enclose your donation. You can drop it in the offering plate, in the church office or mail it to FMSC. You can also **donate** electronically at the <u>Feed My Starving Children FDLMobilePack</u> <u>website</u> or on the <u>church website</u>. Please include our event number **2204-051SC** to your donations to ensure that they will be added to **our** pack on **April 1-2, 2022**.

Volunteering your time, to help pack the meals, is another way you can help MobilePack. **Five hundred fourteen volunteers are needed to pack all the meals!** Volunteer sign-up is open to the public (online) on Tuesday, March 1. In past years, the volunteer slots went quickly so be sure to register early! **You can also reserve your spot by signing up <u>here</u>. Jennifer will then take care of your online registry.**

We hope that you will join us in "being the Church" as we love others in Jesus' name and partner with Feed My Starving Children to turn "Hunger into Hope."

New Telephone System and Internet Upgrades

On February 4, we installed a new telephone system. It operates via the internet – Voice over Internet Protocol or VoIP. The new system has many advanced features including the ability to access



voice mail and change the church's greetings remotely. It will give us more options in retrieving and redirecting calls, as well.

We also upgraded our Internet Router and Switch to give us faster and more consistent internet speeds, more security to our network and adult content monitoring. In addition, new WiFi boosters were installed. The boosters will give us a 25% increase in coverage throughout the building. An additional access point in the Fellowship Hall was installed, too.


