Annual Statistical Report

Every year, Presbyterian churches must file a statistical report with their presbyteries. Typically, the Clerk of Session is responsible for this, and he/she gathers information from church staff and Session minutes to complete the report. The report for 2021 was recently completed and reviewed by session at the February meeting. Some highlights from the report are shared here.

Membership – Total membership decreased from 322 in 2020 to 318 in 2021. We added 7 members through confirmation but lost 11, 2 due to death and 9 members were deleted at their request. There were no baptisms. Weekly worship attendance was estimated to be 75, counting both in-person worship and on-line attendance. In comparison, the church averaged 121 in attendance (before Covid) in the previous year.

Christian Education – The report shows that Sunday School attendance by the youth is down compared to 2020. Approximately 40 youth were involved in Christian Education in 2020 comparing to 24 in 2021. Adult involvement remained relatively constant.

Finances – Annual income rose over 17% in 2021 to \$381,503. Expenses rose over 18% to \$388,083. Annual mission giving rose from \$21,373 to \$35,562.

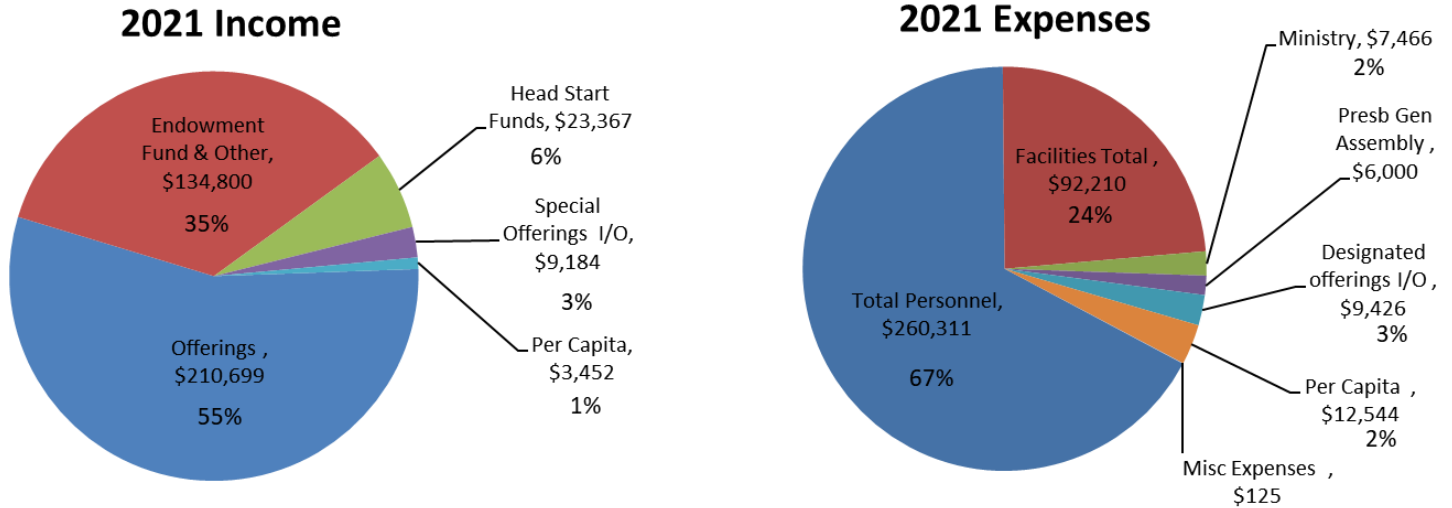
Overall, the church is fairing pretty well, considering the Covid pandemic. It is hopeful that, as we move forward, some of the numbers in worship attendance and Christian education involvement rebound to pre-pandemic levels or even surpass them.

Monthly Financial Update from the Financial Team



Total Income for 2021 - \$381,502

Total Expenses for 2021 - \$388,082

Deficit of -\$6,580

We ended 2021 in a good financial position even though we had a deficit of **-\$6,580** Income vs. Expenses. Our Assets were up to \$336,164.

There have been some concern are that our pledges and offerings are down 15% for the last couple of years. Also, we never receive enough funds to cover our Per Capital expense to the Presbytery which has been down 72%.

Looking forward to 2022, our Fiscal year started in July 2021. At this time, we are still way behind to our budget on offerings by 24%. Expenses are in line, except for facility cost which is up \$15,000.

We plan to replace the church roof this summer at an estimated cost of \$125,000. We're planning on that work to start in June. In April, our plan is to start a financial campaign called "Raise the Roof" to help off-set funding for the roofing project.

My Beloved –

If you worshiped with us yesterday, Ash Wednesday, you were invited to receive the Sacrament of Communion. If you worship with us this coming Sunday, the 1st Sunday of Lent, you will again be offered the Sacrament of Communion.

As Reformed Christians, we recognize two sacraments as “purveyors of divine grace, visible manifestations of God’s invisible love”. Our sacraments were instituted by Jesus and are available to all people. That is a primary difference between our understanding of sacraments and those of some other faith communities. Marriage, for instance, is not for everyone. Likewise, not everyone is an ordained priest.

The first sacrament we observe is the sacrament of Baptism. In baptism we are formally adopted into the faith community as children of God. In baptism, we celebrate what we already know to be true, that God reaches out to us in love long before we even know what love is. When we baptize children, those assuming parental responsibility for them take the appropriate vows on their behalf, promising to raise them in the faith until such time as the children can confirm those vows for themselves.

Our second sacrament is Communion, often called The Lord’s Supper or The Eucharist (from the Greek word for ‘Thanksgiving’). Whereas baptism is only done once, communion can be celebrated much more often. John Calvin, the father of our Reformed theology, encouraged communion as often as every Lord’s Day. Most Presbyterians celebrate the sacrament once a month and on special occasions.

Whereas baptism is the sacrament of welcome into the faith and is celebrated individually, communion is the sacrament of nourishment and is always celebrated communally. In communion we are lifted up into the heavenly realms and experience, together, the life of the saints in full fellowship with God. By receiving the sacrament, we are nourished and strengthened to go into the world and live our lives of faith - the faith in which we were baptized.

I hope that you will avail yourself of communion whenever it is offered. Saints and sinners alike are invited to the holy table. No one asks questions or judges our lives. We are all welcome to enjoy God together.

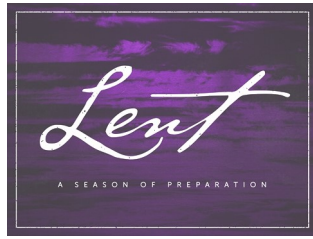

This year we are also excited to be offering an interactive calendar. Each day will have a word of the day and a suggested activity to help us be the "hands and feet of Christ."

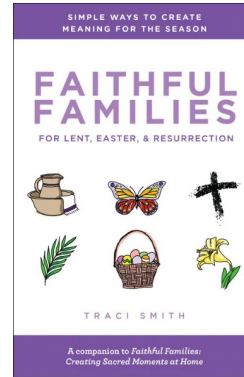

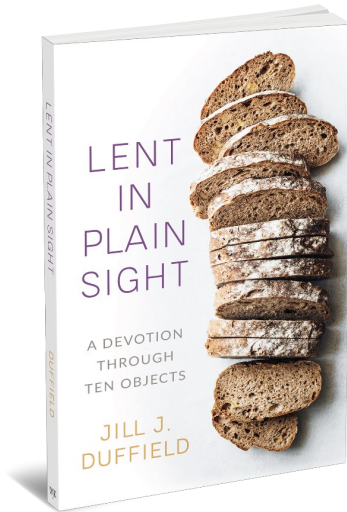

Fond du Lac MobilePack

Friday and Saturday, April 1-2, 2022
Fond du Lac Fairgrounds Rec Building

So much changed in 2020–21, however Feed My Starving Children’s commitment stayed true to feeding God’s children - hungry in body and spirit. We are excited to announce **Friday and Saturday, April 1 - 2, 2022** as the dates of the next Fond du Lac MobilePack.

Your efforts and contributions are even more critical in these unprecedented times. At this point, the global pandemic, and

its economic impact, have left 265 million people on the brink of starvation. (Undernourished children are more susceptible to infectious diseases, like COVID-19.)



Feed My Starving Children resumed MobilePack events in June 2021, with new safety protocols in place. There is a health screen questionnaire, and physical distancing and masking requirement. You will be assigned to a small group and will stay with that same group during the entire process from orientation, to packing to the closing prayer.

Due to these new safety protocols, we have changed our regular packing schedule. The schedule this year will be:

- **Friday, April 1** Set Up and MobilePack
3:30-5:00pm Set Up
6:00-8:00pm Packing Session
- **Saturday, April 2** MobilePack and Clean Up
9:00-11:00am Packing Session
12:30-2:30pm Packing Session
3:00-5:30pm Clean Up

Our goal for 2022 is to pack 101,088 meals! The cost of these meals is \$25,000. Each meal costs about 25 cents so every donation makes a huge impact. A donation of \$88 will feed a child for an entire year. At this point, we have raised \$5,000 towards our goal.

During the month of February, churches throughout our area are participating in the **Have a Heart Campaign to raise the \$25,000 needed for this year’s Fond du Lac MobilePack.** Take one of the hearts and a self-addressed envelopes from the tree in the narthex, enclose your donation. You can drop it in the offering plate, in the church office or mail it to FMSC. You can also **donate** electronically at the [Feed My Starving Children FDLMobilePack website](#) or on the [church website](#). Please include our event number **2204-051SC** to your donations to ensure that they will be added to **our** pack on **April 1-2, 2022.**

Volunteering your time, to help pack the meals, is another way you can help MobilePack. **Five hundred fourteen volunteers are needed to pack all the meals!** Volunteer sign-up is open to the public (online) on Tuesday, March 1. In past years, the volunteer slots went quickly so be sure to register early! **You can also reserve your spot by signing up [here](#).** Jennifer will then take care of your online registry.

We hope that you will join us in “being the Church” as we love others in Jesus’ name and partner with Feed My Starving Children to turn “Hunger into Hope.”

As a reminder, worship folders, filled with activities, are available for the children, in a basket at the back of the sanctuary during each worship service.

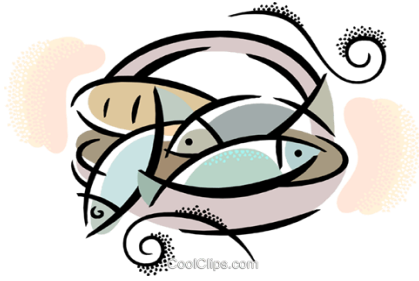
March 27 - Church of our Saviour Organ Concert

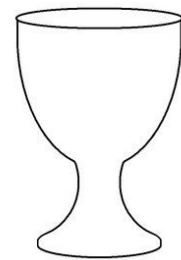

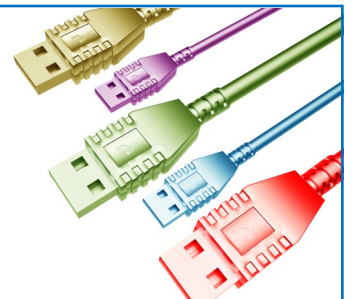
