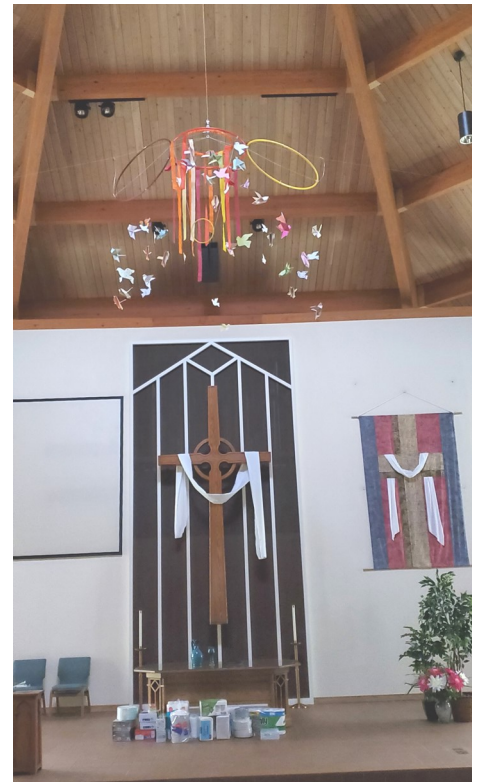

May Session Highlights

At its regular meeting on May 16, the Session had another very full agenda and took the following actions: Reviewed Covid protocols and continued a study on “The Book of Order” led by Pastor Ken.

- Heard a financial report from our treasurer John Neville on the current finances, a preliminary budget for 2022/2023, and the “Raise the Roof” campaign. We are currently blessed with a large balance of funds in reserves which will help support our finances, but Session has concerns over the long run.
- Began work on developing a congregational mission study team. Pastor Ken will be contacting members to help with this team. We will look at where we have been in the past, where we are now and where we want to be in the future. The results of this team’s work will help feed into the selection of our new installed pastor.
- Established a Session organizational meeting for July 23.
- Reviewed the church’s insurance policies for appropriateness.
- Reviewed the results of the recent records review conducted by Winnebago Presbytery. Over 90% of the items reviewed were found to be in order. Many of the missing items were due to the covid situation and the retirement of Pastor Jack. This took a lot of time for Session.
- Heard reports from all teams and staff members.

Many other items were discussed during the meeting. Decisions on these items will be finalized in the future.

The Session continues to work very hard and your prayers of support are always appreciated.

June is certainly going to be a busy month for our congregation. As well as our usual life and ministry together, we have a number of important events and celebrations this month.

June 5th is Pentecost Sunday. This is the great birthday of the church; the day the Holy Spirit enlivened the church to do ministry. It's also the day we'll dedicate our Pentecost offering. Please be sure to wear some RED.

Shortly after the service we will hold our **Annual Congregational Meeting**, as required by our by-laws and our Book of Order. This meeting is a chance to take a good look at ourselves. We will celebrate last year's ministry and look forward to the year to come.

June has every indication of being a busy, meaningful, and productive month.

In the midst of all that we are doing and accomplishing, let's be sure to also work on maintaining our relationship with God. All human relationships require attention. Ignore them for very long and they will fall apart. Our relationship with God is no different. [St. Clare of Assisi](#) famously said, “[W]ho we love shapes what we become. If we love things, we become a thing. If we love nothing, we become nothing.” Let's not get so busy we become nothing. Indeed, what good does it do us if we acquire everything we want, even the world itself, only to lose our own souls? (Cf. Mark 8:36)

Repositioning KIVA Funds

The third organization to which the Serving Team has transferred funds from Kiva is SERRV International.

SERRV's mission of fighting global poverty through fair and ethical trade began in 1949 when helping displaced European refugees trade their handcrafts for income, after the Second World War.

Since then, SERRV has reached 24 countries, working to empower over 8,000 artisans and farmers every year by selling their beautiful handcrafts.

SERRV works with producers in long-term relationships to help them become economically self-sufficient. This is done through product design, training, information, technical assistance, and fair wages.

Like most of the world's poor, the artisans that SERRV works with are often denied access to credit. Investments in the SERRV International Loan Fund allows SERRV to make advance payments to artisans and farmers. This allows the producers to buy raw materials and support their families before their goods are shipped to SERRV. **This fund is an investment, not a donation.** SERRV also provides loans and donations to help build workshops, fund healthcare and education initiatives, recover from natural disasters, and additional community improvement projects, as needed.

The national headquarters of SERRV is in Madison. This proximity has made possible a relationship with members of First Presbyterian Church and the larger community through Just Fare Market. Over the past 14 years, SERRV staff accompanied producer groups leaders to Fair Trade events and informal gatherings. This relationship has led to an understanding and appreciation of the way SERRV walks the walk of their mission "To empower small-scale global artisans and farmers through long-term trading partnerships, helping them build **sustainable employment, resources, rights, and a vision of hope** in their communities."

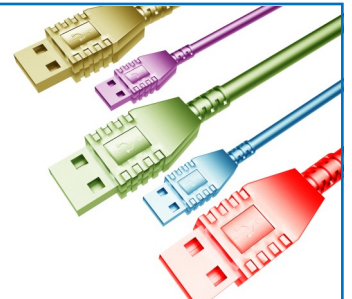
