September Session Highlights

Besides receiving and hearing reports from staff and leadership teams at its regular meeting on September 18, the following items were of note;

- Session approved Pastor Ken's vacation plan for October 18-24 and his education leave for January 9-22. The Loving Team will seek pulpit supply for Pastor Ken's absences from the pulpit.
- Session established a method for their involvement in the new member process. Three elders will meet with prospective members following the final new member training session to interview the candidates. They will in turn report their findings to session.
- October 23 was established as the date to recognize 50-year members Bonnie Hughes and Dan Baker.
- The contract with Head Start was renewed and the monthly rent was increased to reflect the rising cost of utilities.
- It has been determined that two individuals have agreed to fill the two elder vacancies in the class of 2024. This will help tremendously while we return to operating on a January through December basis.
- Church treasurer John Neville reported on the results on the financial review that the Operations Team recently conducted. The review found that no significant changes need to be made.

As always, Session works very hard o conduct the business of the church. They are very grateful to learn of the recruitment of 2 elders to fill vacancies and for your continued support and prayers.

Results from the Mission Study Team Sunday, September 25th

This past Sunday, our Congregational Mission Study Team held a two-part visioning exercise during worship. In the first part, we were introduced to a paraphrased version of the Six Great Ends of the Church (see **Book of Order F-1.0304**). Those present were instructed to choose the three Ends that they thought were the most important for us as a church going forward. Which were the three that we felt God wanted us to put most of our energy and effort into? After the votes were tallied, the results were posted. They are:

- Providing for the Physical and Spiritual Needs of Individuals 62
- Maintaining Regular Worship 53
- Proclaiming the Good News of Salvation 40
- Being the Visible Kingdom of Heaven on Earth 29
- Advocating for Social Justice for the Oppressed 24
- Safeguarding Spiritual and Moral Standards 19

Please note that none of these Ends can ever stand alone. They are all intertwined, each depending on all the others. When we worship regularly, we are safeguarding spiritual and moral standards. Proclaiming the good news of salvation moves us towards providing for the physical and spiritual needs of individuals. Being the visible kingdom of heaven on earth requires advocating for social justice and proclaiming the good news of salvation.

The individual rankings tell us what our priorities are, but none of them can be avoided altogether. While we may concentrate on a few, each of them needs our attention.

In the second part, we were given a list of 10 items that we either talk about, spend energy on or invest money in. In this case, we were asked to choose the five items that we think are most important for us as a congregation moving forward. Which are the five items that we feel God wants us to put the most time and energy into?

After the votes were tallied, the results were posted. They are:

- Caring for our Members and Friends 64
- Local Missions 62
- Children & Youth Faith Formation 58
- Recruit New Members 57
- Adult Faith Formation 47
- Fellowship Activities 38
- Building Maintenance 34
- Music Ministry 28
- Mission Trip 10
- Landscaping 0

Again, each of these matters, but they are all interconnected. A church has to put resources into landscaping. We say we want our church to attract new members, but visitors are never going to enter a church that looks like a vacant lot. We have to have attractive landscaping. Also, a well-maintained church lifts everyone's spirits but a church with maintenance issues looks like no one cares about it. New members get to know their congregation at fellowship activities. Music (and it doesn't matter what kind so much as doing it well) creates a sense of unity and enhances esprit de corps. We want our children and youth to grow in faith, but the reality is that parents (and grandparents) spend more time with their children than we do. If we want children to grow in faith, we must help their adults grow in faith, also.

Results from the Mission Study Team (continued)

The individual rankings reveal our priorities are, but none of them can be avoided altogether. We may concentrate on a few, but each item needs our attention.

These lists are not blueprints for our future. Rather, they are broad guides to what we as a congregation value and believe God wants us to invest in. They are our understanding of the general direction in which we believe God wants us to go.

Also, these lists can help our future Pastor Nominating Committee discern who will be the best pastor for our church. Sharing these lists with a prospective pastor is a good way of learning what the pastor values and helping the pastor discern if we are a good fit for them. It would be tragic to call someone who is friendly, outgoing and a spellbinding preacher only to learn that their values are the opposite of ours.

We will have one more such exercise, during worship, on October 9. Then, we will be given a list of 20 attributes or skills we think would be valuable in our next installed pastor. This time, we will be asked to choose our top 10. Again, the results will be shared during the service, and we will have a chance to discuss them.

Operations Team

Mission Statement - Develop Consistent Togetherness with Good Communication Skills

Operations Team Summary

- On August 29th Team members met with Head Start staff to introduce the Operations Team and office staff. We went on a tour of the facilities and recapped procedures for the coming year. Dave did an excellent job organizing all responsibilities and procedures for the Head Start teachers. An updated contract was signed. The rent was increased to help cover rising utility costs. Head Start approved the church's security camera upgrade and has already sent payment for half of the project.
- Our new church roof is completed with gutters and down spouts. There are a few odds and ends around the cupola that still require attention. That should be completed by the end of September, weather permitting. The total roofing cost will be under the \$120,000 budget. The 'Raise the Roof Campaign' has brought in almost half of the \$120,000 needed to pay for the total project.
- Our outside soffit lights and new photo-eye have been installed. AC inspection and furnace inspection have also been completed. All maintenance to be completed by the end of September.
- A review/audit of our financial records and processes was conducted on September 12, 2022 with Bill Kuespert (Member at Large), Dave Seibel (Faith Lutheran Church), Scott Richter (church accountant), Mary Robotka (Financial Assistant) and John Neville (Treasurer). Everything went well and no recommended changes were suggested at the completion of the review. Thanks to John Neville. This internal audit saved the church \$10,000 verses having a complete audit done by an outside firm.

Operations Team

Compassion Fund

The First Presbyterian Church Compassion Fund exists to help an individual or family meet a serious emergency need. It was established for church members and/or for those who have an established relationship with First Presbyterian Church.

Often, the funds have been for paying rent (to avoid eviction), or for utility bills. Compassion Funds might be used in case of a medical need that requires frequent out of the area travel to help cover resulting expenses. The need is to be of a serious emergency kind.

Procedure for application:

- •A fund request is made by contacting the Pastor or one of the Deacon Co-Chairs.
- •In keeping with IRS rules the fund pays the bill directly to whom it is owed.
- •Generally, the assistance is limited to once a year, NOT on a recurring basis. (Individuals with continuing needs are helped to access other resources.)
- •Requests to receive help with a financial emergency are also welcome, at any time.

Traditionally the December Cookie Walk, sponsored by the Deacons, was the source of funds for the Compassion Fund. Individuals have made monetary donations and donations of food or gas gift cards, as well. Because of the pandemic in 2020-2021, the Deacons solicited donations in exchange for collection of favorite cookie recipes. Members of the congregation have been very generous, and the fund has grown.

"Stewardship - Is it Always About Money?"

Mention the word 'stewardship' in a room full of Christians and someone will invariably say, "Stewardship is always more than money." This is true.

Psalm 24:1 says, "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it." On God's behalf, we Christians are the managers, caretakers, stewards of the earth "and all that is in it". All that is in it. Not just the air, and ocean, and land. On God's behalf we are the stewards of the house we live in, the car we drive, the profession we practice and the relationships we create. On God's behalf we are stewards of our time, our skills, our energy. On God's behalf, we are also the stewards of the money in our pockets, our bank account, our IRA.

We have just entered the last quarter of our fiscal year. In a few months we will be celebrating the birth of our savior. Now is a good time to ask ourselves if our stewardship this past year reflects our love for our savior.

If it does, well and good. If not, maybe now is the time to catch up. If this year has been tough on your finances and you are just scraping by, we understand.

If you can, now is also a very good time to be generous. We want to finish our fiscal year in a strong, healthy position. If you have been blessed this year, are you thanking God by sharing your blessings with others?

Let's use the time between now and Christmas to make sure our stewardship, in its totality, reflects our love and gratitude for our savior.

Yes, stewardship is always more than money. But stewardship is also never less than money.

Let's show our love for God by being good stewards of the earth and <u>ALL</u> that is in it. Including our money.


