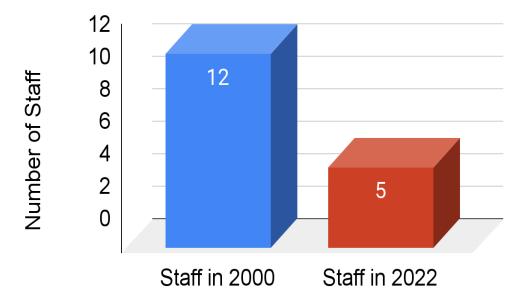

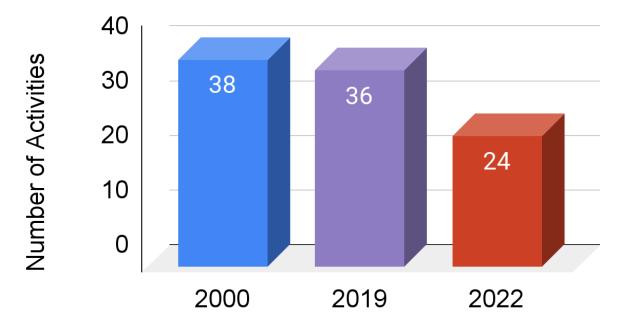

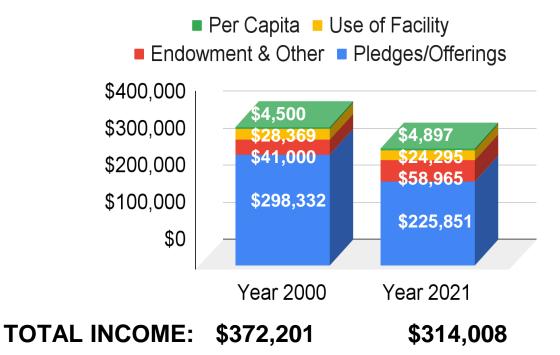

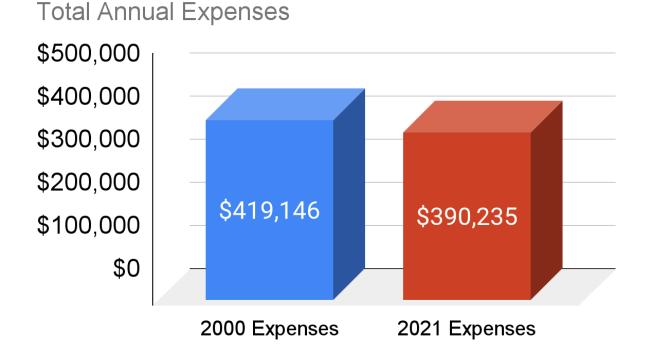

## 2000 vs. 2019 vs. 2022 Ministry Activities

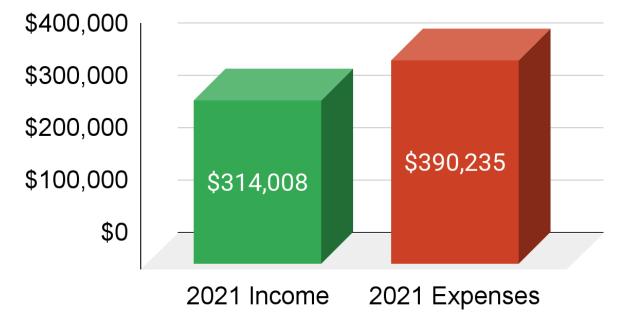


Total Annual Income

## Since 2000:

Membership has decreased by 45% Attendance has decreased by 73% Staffing has decreased by 60%

Budget income has decreased by 15%

Budget expenses have decreased by 7%

\*\*Our expenses have dropped, but our income has dropped even more.\*\*

# What does this mean for the future mission of FPC?

At our current rate of spending, within 2 to 3 years, our checking/savings/stock account assets will be depleted.

This money is used to cover:

- Budget deficits
- Building maintenance projects

\*\*We can't continue our current financial trajectory without a significant increase in giving.\*\*

## What does this mean for the future mission of FPC?

As we rebuild our ministries post-Covid, we need to keep in mind that we only have:

27% of the attendance we did back in 2000
35% of the paid staff we did back in 2000

\*\*There are simply less staff and members to volunteer.\*\*
