October Session Highlights

Every month, Pastor Ken poses a situation to the Session that a church could face, at some point. It is a way of developing Session's knowledge and understanding of the Presbyterian Church's rules and regulations. In October's Session meeting, the situation we discussed involved a congregation member arguing about the church budget at a congregational meeting. The member was hoping to change the budget. Is this proper procedure? Session members learned that the Book of Order G-3.0205 states that Session has the responsibility to develop and administer the church's financial resources. While a discussion like this can occur at an annual meeting, the Session is the only body that can make changes to the budget. Exercises like these have been very beneficial to all our Session members.

Session received a report from the Membership Committee regarding their work. The membership committee has developed a list of church members who have not been active in the life of the church, physically or financially, for the past two years. Session supports the Membership Team's plan to have the church send a letter to these people in an effort to clarify their intentions regarding membership. More action on this will come to Session in November.

Financial approvals were made as follows:

- \$700 for Thanksgiving food bags (Serving Team)
- \$150 for gifts for names not selected for the Angel Tree
- KIVA funds of \$3,221.62 were approved to be distributed equally among these funds; SERVV International, One Acre Fund, and Village Enterprise Fund.

Pastor Ken laid out the timeline for the work of the Congregational Mission Study Team (CMST). The CMST will present a synopsis of their work to the congregation following worship on November 6. Their final report, if approved by Session, will be sent to the Winnebago Presbytery COM. If the COM approves it, then the Session will begin development of the Pastor Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee will lead us to our next installed pastor in the months to follow.

It's an exciting time to be involved at First Presbyterian Church.

Thanksgiving Mission 2022

Thanksgiving is coming soon - the time of year where we celebrate our bounty and blessings with family, friends, and others with gratitude, and usually with a shared meal with loved ones.

For many years, our Thanksgiving Mission has been to provide food “bags” for individuals and families who also receive services at the Fond du Lac County Department of Community Programs (DCP) (the local public mental health center on 1st Street). The people we serve have been diagnosed with “severe and persistent” mental illness. Some attend the Day Treatment Program, four days per week. This is a wonderful opportunity for them as it provides a structured, encouraging, supportive community. Some have an Outreach Worker who helps regularly in the community with his/her consumer to maintain stability and safety. All our recipients have a psychiatrist and take psychotropic medications. Nursing services are also available for medication management.

Almost all our recipients live at the poverty level. They survive on SSI (Supplemental Security Income) and Medicaid benefits. All live independently, in HUD housing, rooming houses, “shared living homes” or with their families. Some families do have children.

People with severe mental illness, such as schizophrenia, have difficulty with socialization, especially with people they don't know. While churches and others provide Thanksgiving Day meals, our mission allows people to have food on the big day, and leftovers too, without stress. We are faithfully ministering to “the least of these, our brethren” in this mission.

Every year we get feedback from those we serve. Some of the singles ask, with hope, if they will be “getting the bag” again. They look forward to their meal and are so grateful and happy that we remember them.

We shop for the usual Thanksgiving fare which consists of the following:

Turkey, turkey gravy, instant mashed potatoes, boxed stuffing, canned vegetables and fruit, sweet potatoes, cranberry sauce, fresh carrots, Jell-O, dinner rolls, pumpkin pie, frozen Graham crackers and packaged cookies.

After we shop, we go to the Day Treatment area at DCP, meet a staff member there and sort all the groceries. The food is bagged and labeled as ‘single’ or ‘family’. We include a note wishing our recipients a Happy Thanksgiving from First Presbyterian Church. We say a prayer of Thanksgiving for ourselves for the great blessing we receive from helping others.

In 2021, we served 17 adults and 12 children. Eleven of the adults were singles. The total cost was \$688.63. This year, 2022, the Serving Team has set aside \$700 from their designated mission fund. Since inflation has increased food costs, monetary donations would be greatly appreciated. The envelopes in the pews can be used. Please remember to indicate “Thanksgiving Bags” on them.

We are returning to Festival Foods to purchase groceries. They have been so helpful and will let us do bulk ordering for frozen turkeys and pies.

There will be a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Center for people interested in helping with this project. We need people who would like to help with the shopping, transporting the food to DCP, sorting the food, bagging, and labeling. We will meet at Festival Foods on Monday, November 21, at 9:00am. DCP staff will deliver all the Thanksgiving bags to the recipients.

November Affirmations from Pastor Ken

November will be a busy month for our church. I hope you will be able to participate in what we are doing.

After Worship on Sunday, November 6th, our Congregational Mission Study Team will give our final report to the congregation. This will be a summary/ wrap-up of all we've learned and presented so far, as well our recommendations to the session and the yet-to-be-elected Pastor Nominating Committee. If you want to know what the PNC will be looking for, you need to attend this presentation.

At the close of Worship on Sunday, November 13th, we will have a short congregational meeting to elect officers. Choosing our leadership is one of the great joys and responsibilities of being Presbyterian. I hope that you will be here to help elect and pray for those who will help guide us in the coming years.

November 20th is Christ the King Sunday, marking the end of our liturgical year. On this day we especially celebrate the lordship of Jesus. During worship, I will give a "State of the Church" presentation. I will talk about the state of Christianity in America today and what we can expect in the next 50 years. There is both peril and promise ahead. Being forewarned, we can mitigate the first and enhance the latter.

Finally, **November 27th is the First Sunday of the Holy Season of Advent**, which runs through December 24th. It is also the beginning of our new liturgical year. Don't be surprised if you hear someone wishing you a "Happy New Year" on November 27th! In worship, we will change some of the refrains we have been singing and most of our Gospel Lessons will come from Matthew rather than Luke.

The word *Advent* derives from the Latin verb to *arrive* or *come*. "When are you *arriving*, when are you *coming* home?" Advent is a time of preparing ourselves for looking backwards with joy and thanksgiving at Jesus' birth and looking forward with hope and expectation for his eventual return.

In the early church, Advent was celebrated much like Lent. It was a time of fasting and prayer, not endless Christmas carols, baking, and wrapping presents. This year, how will you celebrate Advent? Maybe you can use November to think about it!

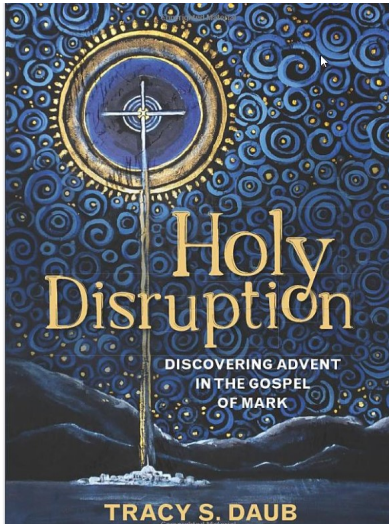

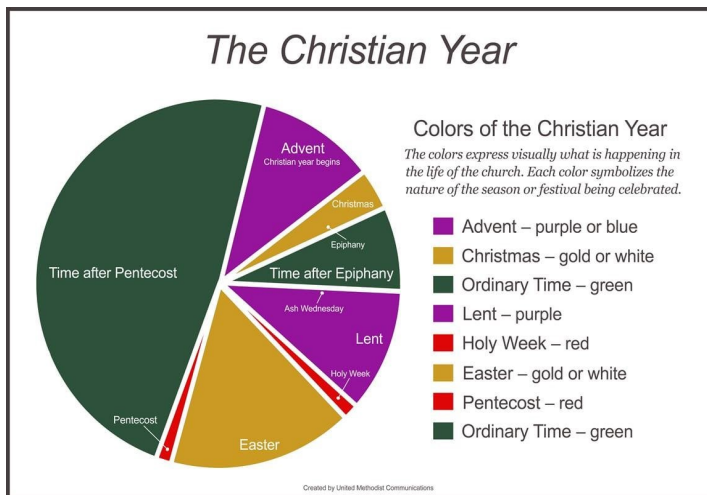

What is the purpose of a Cantor on Sunday Morning?

Cantor is a Latin term meaning Singer. We loosely use the term on Sunday morning for the person who leads us in hymns and songs during worship. In our setting, cantors are to encourage, support and give direction to the congregation regarding the musical parts of the service. The goal is to help an assembly of 80 to 100 people to sing with joy and confidence.

What's a Church Year Calendar?

The short answer is, the church year, or liturgical year, is an annual cycle of seasons and days observed in Christian churches. These seasons commemorate the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Last Sunday of the Church Year is Christ the King Sunday

Why is the purple Lenten banner hanging up? As we celebrate Jesus Christ as Lord over all creation, let us remember

the crown he wore and reason he is our Savior and Lord. Christ lived, Christ died, Christ rose and will come again. Christ the King Sunday is always celebrated on the last Sunday of our Church Calendar Year. For those who like to plan it is always the Sunday before Advent, which is always the Sunday before Thanksgiving.

First Sunday of the Church Year is the First Sunday of Advent

Advent is the time of preparation and waiting for the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ. We spend four Sundays preparing, lighting candles, decorating, baking, buying presents in anticipation of one important day in the Christian Church Calendar Year, Jesus' birth.

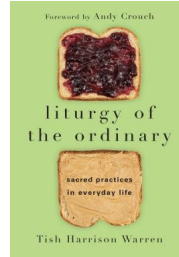

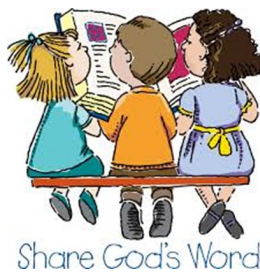

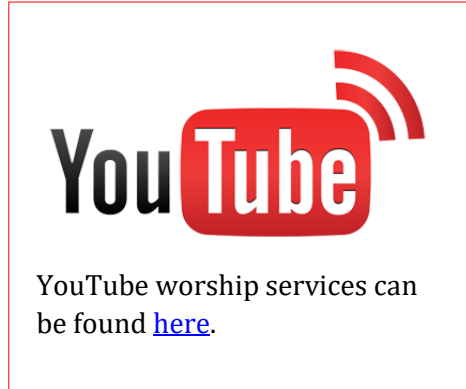
