Pastor Nominating Committee Update

Your Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has been busy since being approved at the Congregational meeting on January 29th.

The first step in the process was completing the Ministry Information Form (MIF) which describes our church's vision for ministry and mission. The Congregational Mission Study Report was instrumental in the development of the MIF. After approval by Session and the Presbytery Commission on Ministry, the MIF went "live" on the PCUSA's Church Leadership Connection website on March 9.

The PNC asks for the prayers of the Congregation as we continue this journey of discovery and discernment.

Session Highlights

At its regular monthly meeting, Session had a visit from two members of the Winnebago Presbytery's Commission on Ministry (COM). They were there to hear from Session and church staff about various aspects of Pastor Ken's ministry with us and how they (COM) can help during the transition to calling an installed pastor. (Pastor Ken was excused from this portion of the meeting.) Much of the information shared will not be shared here due to confidentiality but the meeting was very productive.

One item that COM shared with Session was the Presbytery's Separation Policy. The policy states that when a pastoral relationship is dissolved the Presbytery opposes any attempts by either the pastor or the church to maintain any kind of relationship, both formal or informal. This is done to make it easier for the new incoming pastor.

In other action, Session approved a document prepared by Pastor Ken entitled "What Do We Believe". It is, in essence, the church's faith statement and will be posted on the church's website to tell visitors to the site what we believe about God and the Bible.

Session also acted on the following:

Form a team to review the current background check policy and make recommendations for change Approve Endowment Board By-law changes

Approve PYA's serving of breakfast on Easter Sunday. Proceeds will go toward their mission activities.

Earlier in the month, Session met with the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) and approved the Ministry Information Form (MIF). The form has since been posted on-line and is already attracting interested pastoral candidates.

Looking forward, Session is looking at how we will meet pastoral needs until the next installed pastor arrives. The Worship Team is looking at some creative ways to conduct worship services, which should be interesting. Worship Team is also lining up pulpit supply pastors to lead worship during this transition. The COM from Winnebago Presbytery is working on providing a moderator for Session/Congregational meetings.

SEPARATION ETHICS POLICY PRESBYTERY OF WINNEBAGO

For Departure of a Pastor from a Congregation

Approved August 2007

The life of every congregation is punctuated by the coming and going of pastors; and the professional life of most pastors is punctuated by several changes in positions. For both the congregation and the pastor, it is important for these transitions to take place in as healthy a manner as possible.

Pastors and congregations form unique, personal bonds and relationships during their times of ministry together. When a pastoral relationship is dissolved or ended, it is understandable that the pastor and his/her former parishioners would like to stay in touch and continue the relationship they have enjoyed. However, doing so makes it more difficult for congregations to begin forming new bonds and relationships with their new pastor.

Therefore, the Presbytery of Winnebago rejects any pastoral activities which invade another teaching elder or commissioned ruling elder's call without a specific invitation from that minister, including returning to a former calling body for pastoral services. It is affirmed that this applies to all members of Winnebago Presbytery, including interim pastors, commissioned ruling elders, and student pastors.

"After the dissolution of the pastoral relationship, former pastors and associate pastors shall not provide their pastoral services to members of their former congregations without the invitation of the moderator of session." (G-2.0905)

The Presbytery opposes any fostering of informal relationships in congregations in which a former pastor has served, which, in the perceptions of the current pastor, session, or the Presbytery harm the ministry of the current pastor or pastors. This is particularly applicable to social media/on-line interaction. The departing pastor should exercise discipline in order to find ways to remove undue social media visibility.

April Affirmations from Pastor Ken

"Not the End." 2 Corinthians 5:14-17

"From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: . . . see, everything has become new."

This coming week, the first full week of April, we will observe Holy Week – the holiest week of our Christian Year. On Sunday, April 2 we will gather as we usually do at 9:00 to worship God. That Sunday is Palm Sunday. We will wave palms and reenact Jesus' triumphal procession into Jerusalem. On Thursday, April 6, we will gather for worship at 7:00 to observe Maundy Thursday. This was the evening when Jesus gathered with his 12 closest followers and celebrated the Jewish festival of Passover. But in this instance, there was no sacrificial lamb. Jesus offered himself as the sacrificial lamb for all humanity.

Friday, Good Friday, marks the day Jesus was killed by crucifixion. He died on Friday and was buried late in the afternoon.

On Easter Sunday, April 9, we will joyfully worship and celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead.

When reflecting on the joys of Easter, it's important to remember that Easter is not an end in itself. Yes, it marks the end of the season of Lent, but it is more than that. Easter, like a wedding service, marks both the end of one way of living and the beginning of another way of living.

Jesus' death and resurrection is the transformative, life-changing event for all of life. Nothing is ever the same after Jesus' death and resurrection. No longer do we live for ourselves; doing what we want, what we think is best for us or our loved ones. Now, we live for Jesus. That is, we live in a way that is first and foremost pleasing to Jesus. Every other consideration comes a distant second.

That means we no longer look at a person's exterior. We no longer consider their outward appearance, their wealth/poverty, their social status, sexual orientation, how many children they have or how important they are at work. All of those 'human' considerations are a distant second.

Now, we look at the inner person. What is in their heart. Now, before condemning someone, we stop and ask how it came to be that they did some horrible things. Now, before judging someone, we stop and ponder how they came to be in such a situation in the first place.

This way of looking at individuals also applies to how we look at and evaluate churches, including our own. No longer do we measure our church, or any church, by the size of its budget, the size of its choir or the size of its youth group. We do not evaluate any church, even our own, by the style of its worship, the quality of its music, the beauty of its landscaping, or any other human metric.

Instead, we look at a church, especially our own, to see what is in its heart. The landscaping may be beautiful and the sanctuary may be huge, but what we must consider is how well that church is looking at, and ministering to, its congregation and others. The old ways of evaluating have to be let go and these new measures embraced.

So, while Easter culminates the holiest week of our year, it is not something we'll wrap up on Sunday and be done with for a while. Rather, it is a life-changing event pointing us in a new direction. Easter is the end of Lent, *and* the beginning of a new way of living.

The good news of Easter is that in Jesus we are ALL new. Even our church. May we all think about each other not according to the old, 'human' way, but in the new, Easter way.




